Mr. Kampa has attended Itasca Junior College and the University of Minnesota.

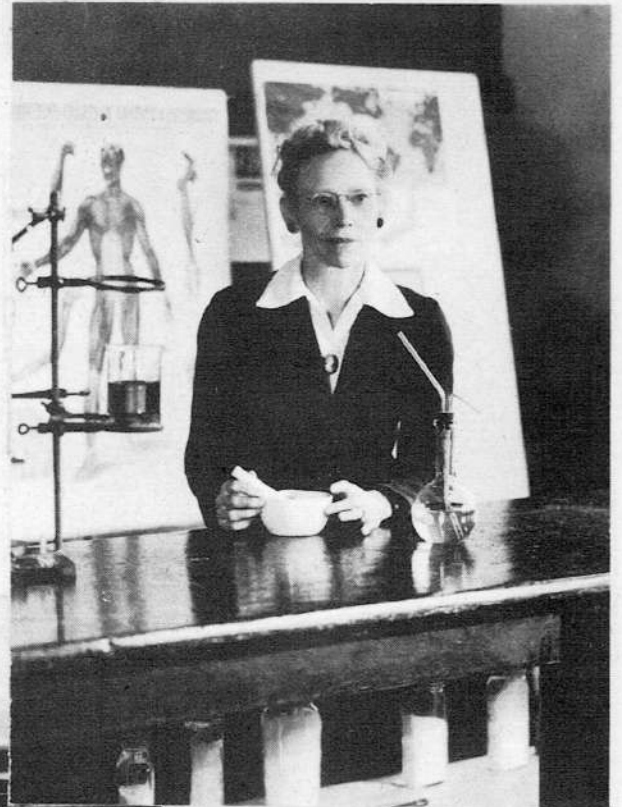
He is principal of P.O.H.S. this year and is also advisor of the Annual Staff and coach of the basket ball and volley ball teams.

She teaches Freshman Mathematics, Geometry, English 1, and Home Economics.







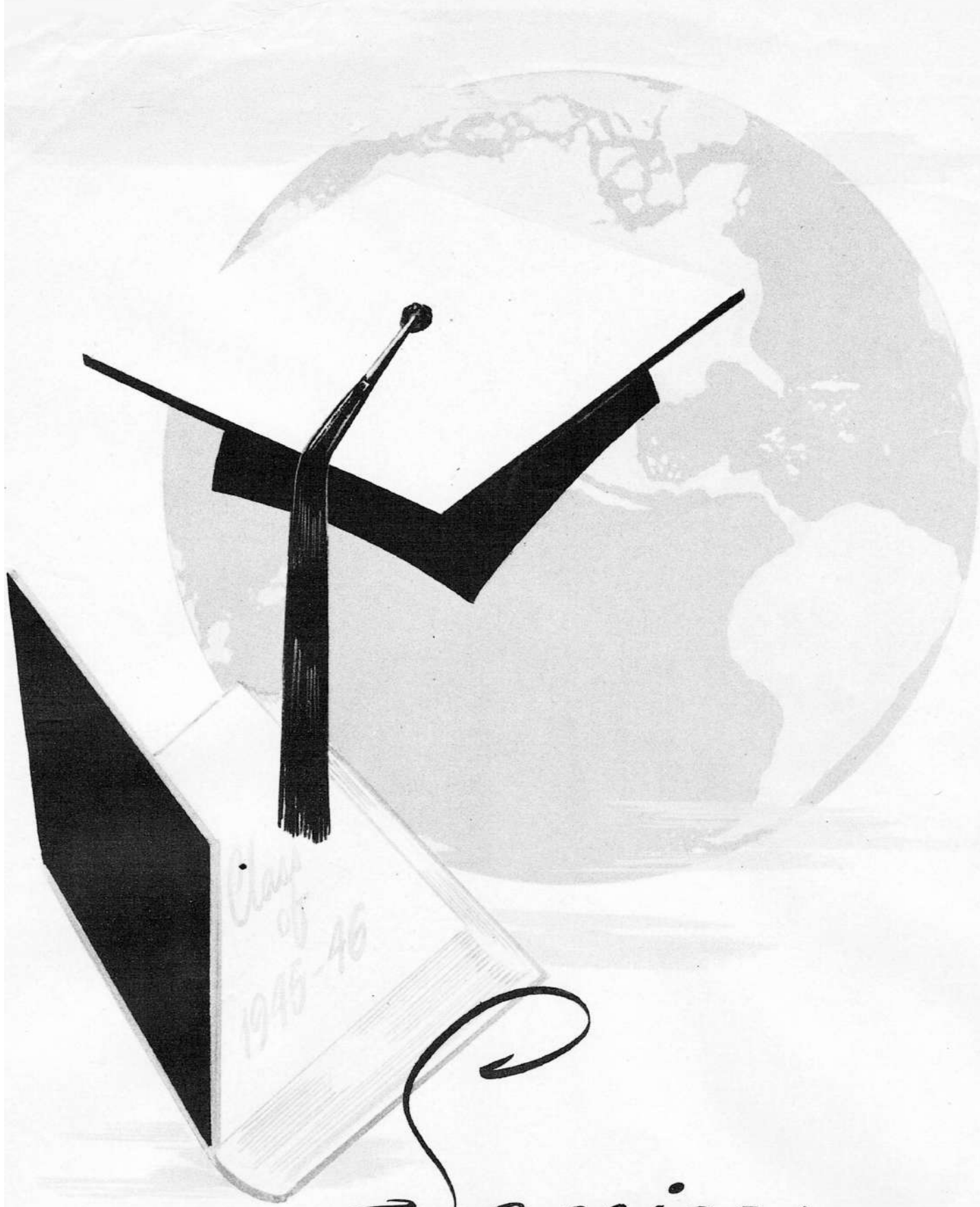

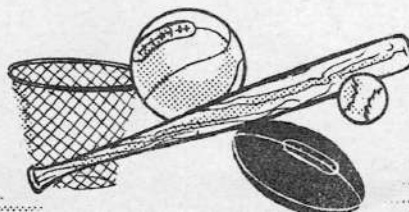

Dorothy played on the Volley Ball Team four years, while Mary Lou played two years, attaining captainship during her senior year.

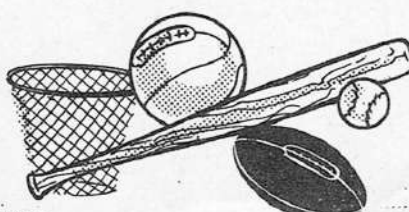
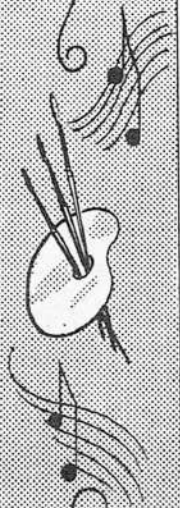


## JUNIOR CLASS

As was the custom, unusual costumes were worn for three days. Crawling to and from classes and bowing to all upper classmen were among the initiation ceremonies.

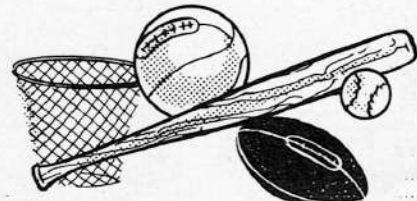
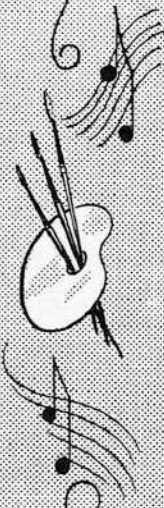

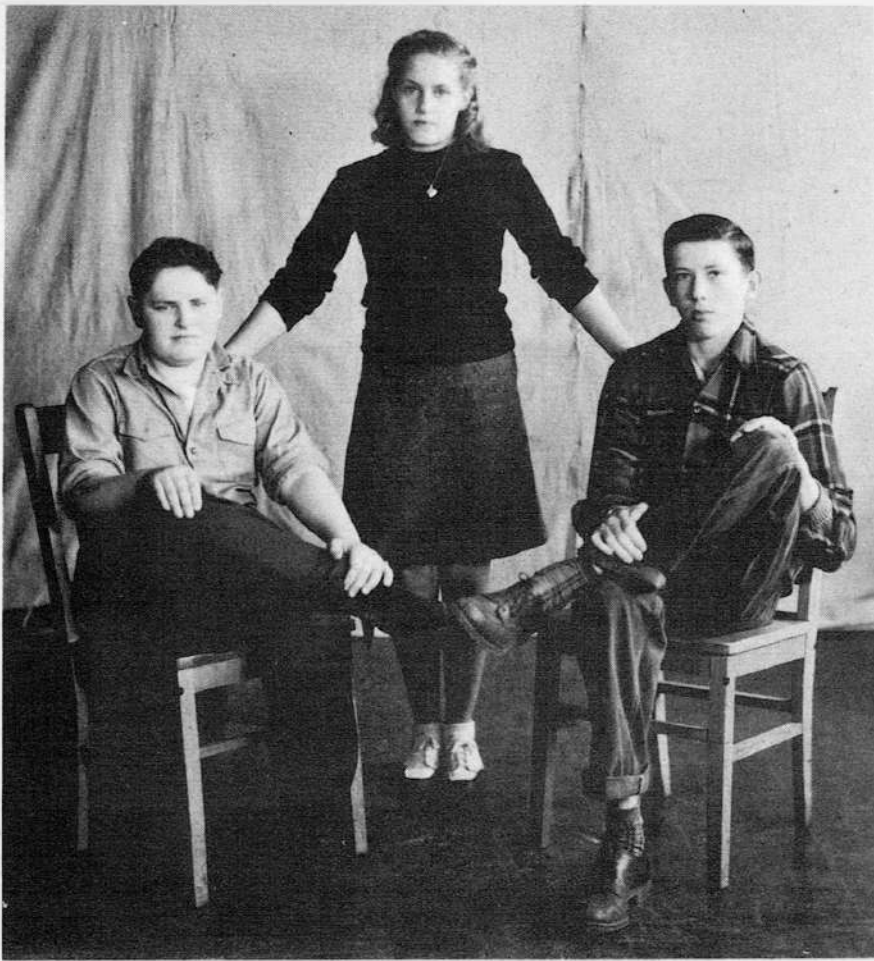
In the month of November the class number was increased to thirteen with the addition of two new members, Mary Ellen Stratton and Charline Quigley.

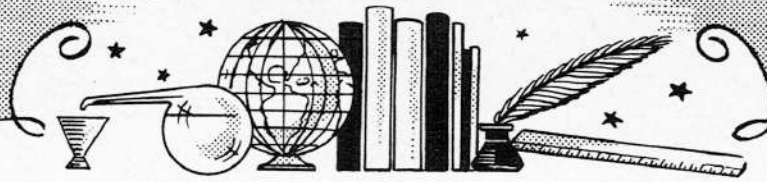

Following this, we studied interior decorating.

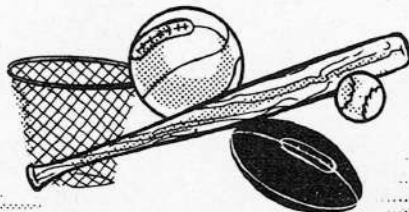

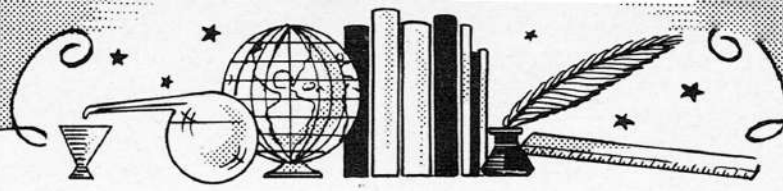
In the early spring sewing was again taken up. This period was used for the making of spring and summer clothes.

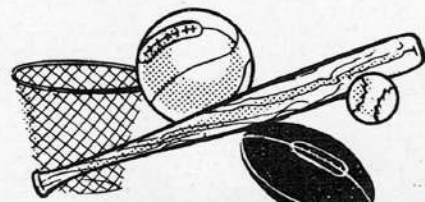
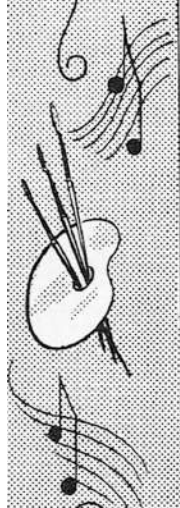
At first it looked as though there would be no "LOG" published this year. However, we were finally able to work out a system for publications.

### GIRLS' ATHLETICS

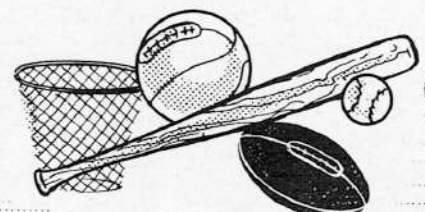
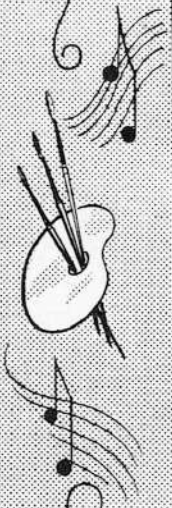
