

Mr. Hagen teaches U.S. history-civics, world geography, typing, bookkeeping, and physical education.





This year Miss Cary has taught general science, general mathematics, chemistry, and algebra.








When we entered as freshmen there were six in the class, five boys and one girl who were imbued with the study habit. We were intiated during the first part of the year and all went well thereafter.




Then came the thrill of being upper-classmen. By the middle of our junior year our number decreased to two and, being twins, there was a great possibility that we would hold out until the end.




SOPHOMORE CLASS
