Although two of the class members have left, bringing the membership down to a total of thirteen the school spirit has increased and the Juniors look forward to their Senior year with the highest hopes.






After a joint session of the county coaches, two of the members, Jack Smith and Blaine Marsh, were chosen as forward and guard of the all-tour-nament team.





