



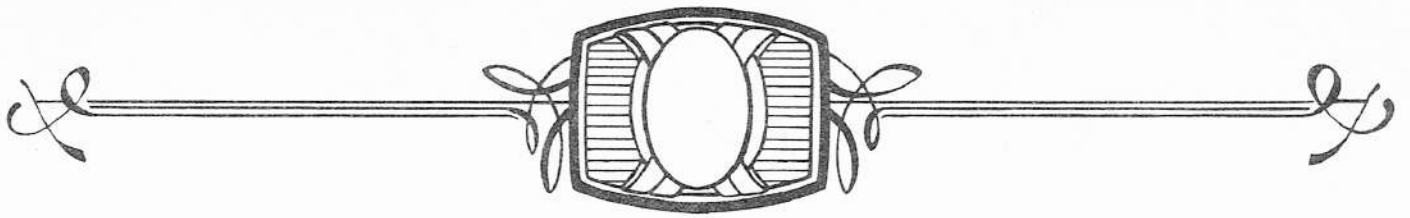

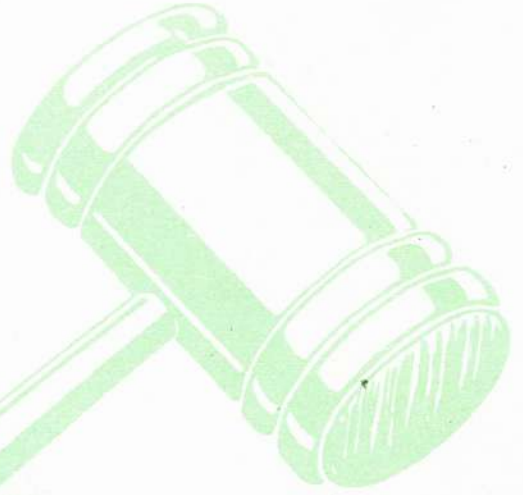
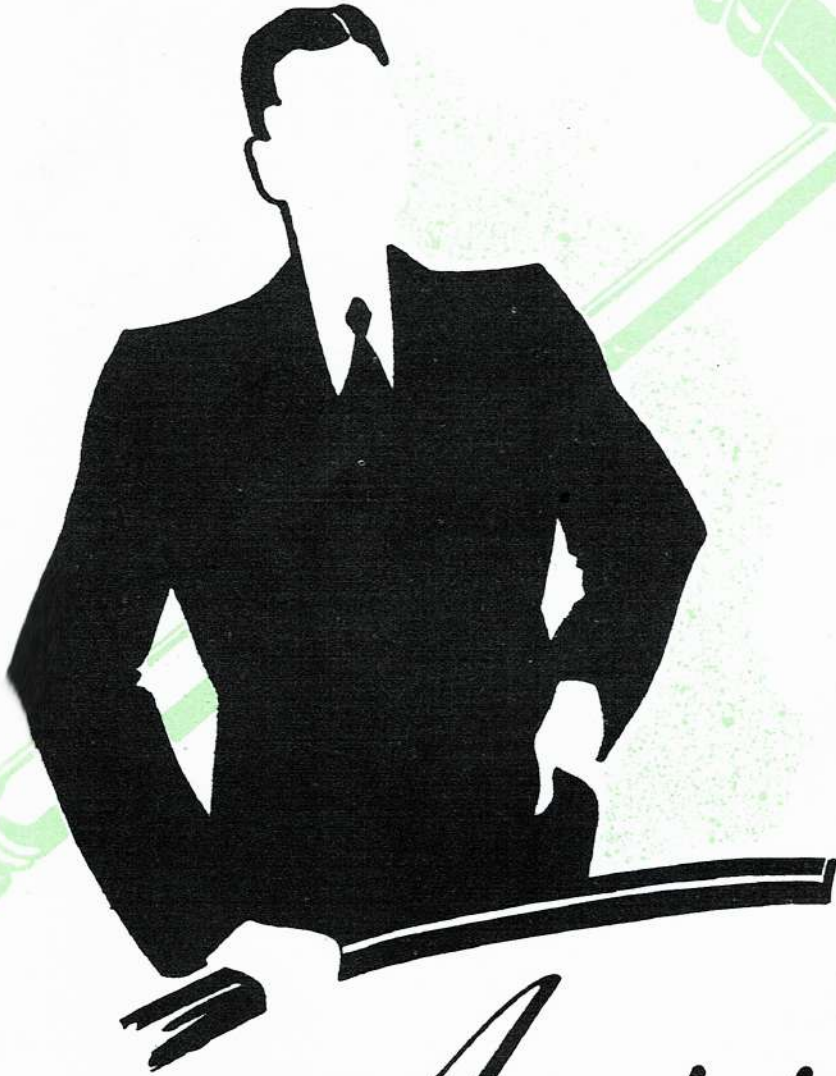
Dedication

Mr. Joseph E. Kampa

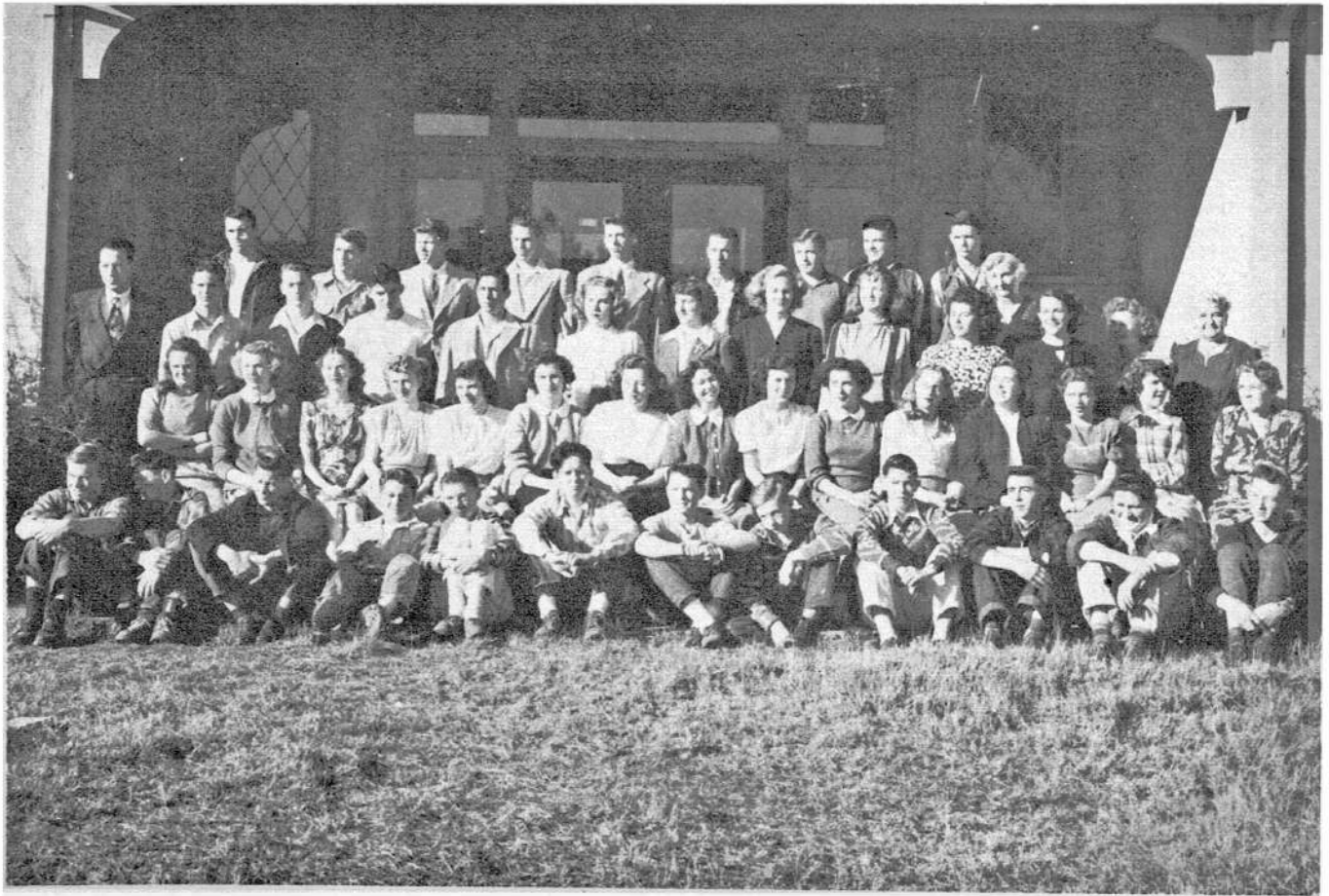

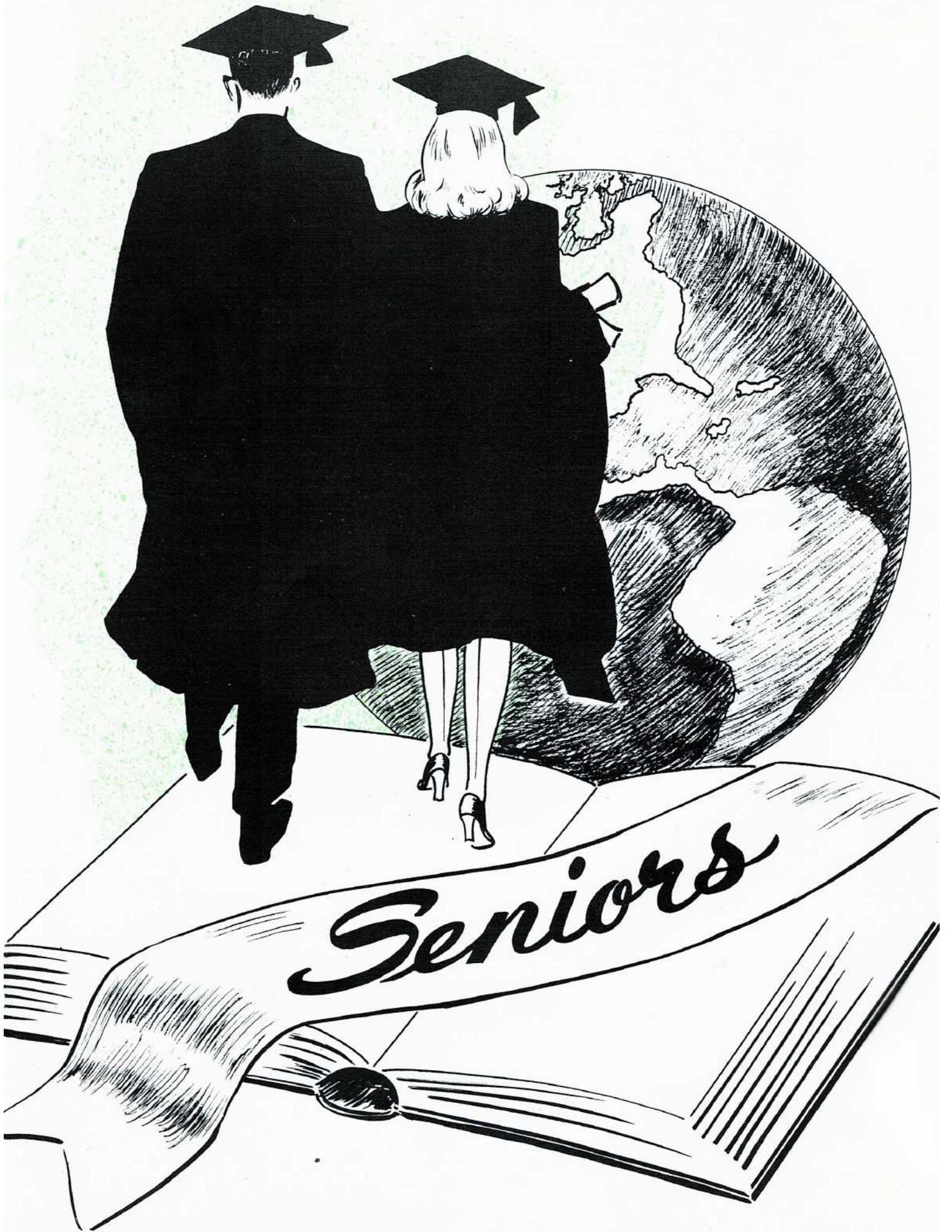


Miss Nellie Shepherd

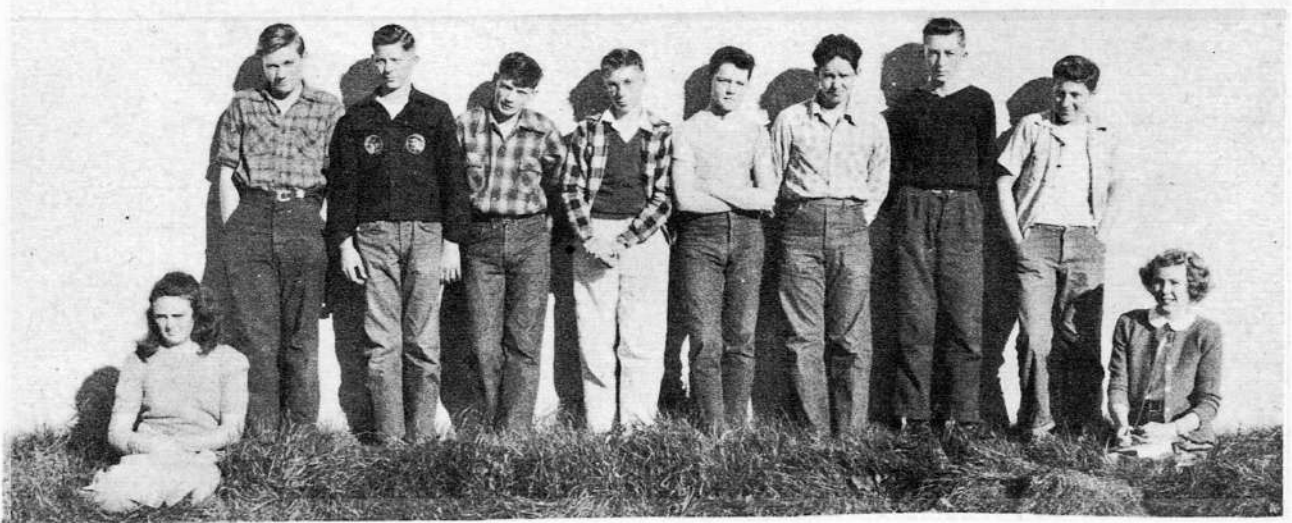

Johnny Bright, forward, dropped out of school right after the Brookings game and the team again suffered a big loss.

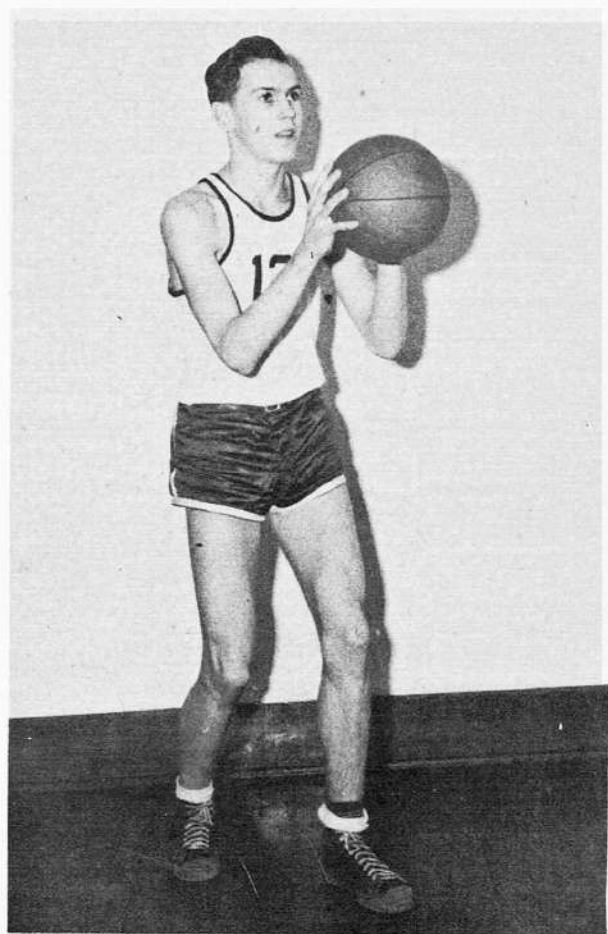
