The athletic field is a concrete example of what can be accomplished when a community backs its school activities; while this annual is a written record of these activities.







Appointed as yell queens were Beverly Mermilloid and Barbara Seeber. Both of them were new to the school and to yell leading so they tried very hard to do well.











Morman Holycross Forward Height 5'7" Weight 150 lbs. Sophomore Pt. Ave. 4.909








Darell Holycross Forward Height 5'8" Weight 150 lbs. Junior Pt. Ave. 10.454







