The Junior class, at the present time the far smallest class in school, started their four year term of high school on September 8, 1947.


They began with nine boys and two girls. During the freshman year Jo Anne Chapman left. Not long afterward they gained Sandra Rohner and Richard Jamieson.







### Sophomore Class


On September 3, 1948, a group of excited freshman entered Port Orford High. They managed to live through initiation, and after that it didn't take long to make theirselves at home.


They are in number about the same as last year with some dropping out and some new members coming in.

They are willing to add, that five freshman boys played on the first and second string of the high-school basketball team; four freshmen girls played on the volley ball team.






THE PORT ORFORD SCHOOL BAND


