

So from our Saltwater Preeminence we greet you and wish you, both now and in the future, all the blessing of our American heritage of independence, initiative, and faith in God and man.



THE PIRATES


The pirates chalked up a successful season in basketball with 13 wins and 6 losses out of a total of 19 games of which 9 were played on the home courts.










The cafeteria is at the grade school so the students have to either walk or ride down on the bus depending on the weather.


"Uncle Fred Flits By"


