
The Junior Class sponsored the Junior Variety show. We also sponsored the Junior-Senior Banquet.


Judy Jensen was a cheerleader and Jean Norris was a pepster.

On the volleyball team were Mary Miller, Jean Storm, Nancy Brown, and Judy Boice.



The boys were also active in many sports. Those playing on the Junior Varsity were: Harold Neff, Ronnie Bird, and Bill Whalen.




