


DOUGLAS C. ORTON




ALIDA R. BENDER





THOMAS W. RADCLIFFE

Miss Wilson, who grew up in Roseburg, is a graduate of Roseburg High School, and holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Oregon State University.






GLEN A. KADELBACH


BARBARA R. DODRILL


Mr. Hoover gives tests of all kinds, works with college admission procedures for Seniors, and helps with scheduling classes, career planning, and scholarship application.






Mark George, a folk singer, sang some songs for us. He was a member of the Heart Fund drive and was a victim of heart disease when he was 8 years old.




The Sweethearts Ball, one of the three traditional dances, was presented by the class of '75. The band, Sobroad, set the atmosphere with the typical soothing dance step.





















Mr. Tom Radcliffe presented the diplomas, and Mrs. Barbara Dodrill gave the awards and scholarships.


