The 1973 Homecoming game was between us and Yoncalla. It was a close game and the Pirates played a real good game, but Yoncalla won 20-18.




The Homecoming Dance was held in the gym, after the game, from 10:30 to 12:30. Approximately 150 people attended the dance.




HOMECOMING GAME



The people of this year's council learned that each must take a leadership attitude and take part or we will fail in our goals.







The Pacific Future Business Leaders of America Chapter has seven members. Its purpose is to promote better business practices among future business leaders.


Some of their activities include selling advertising to finance their activities of printing the Football, and Basketball rosters, and attending the state convention in Portland.







The board has also been talking about having somone stay in a trailer-house at Pacific, to keep an eye on the school.




SHELLEY PUTNAM




DOUGLAS ORTON


WILLIAM BECKMAN










THOMAS RADCLIFFE
