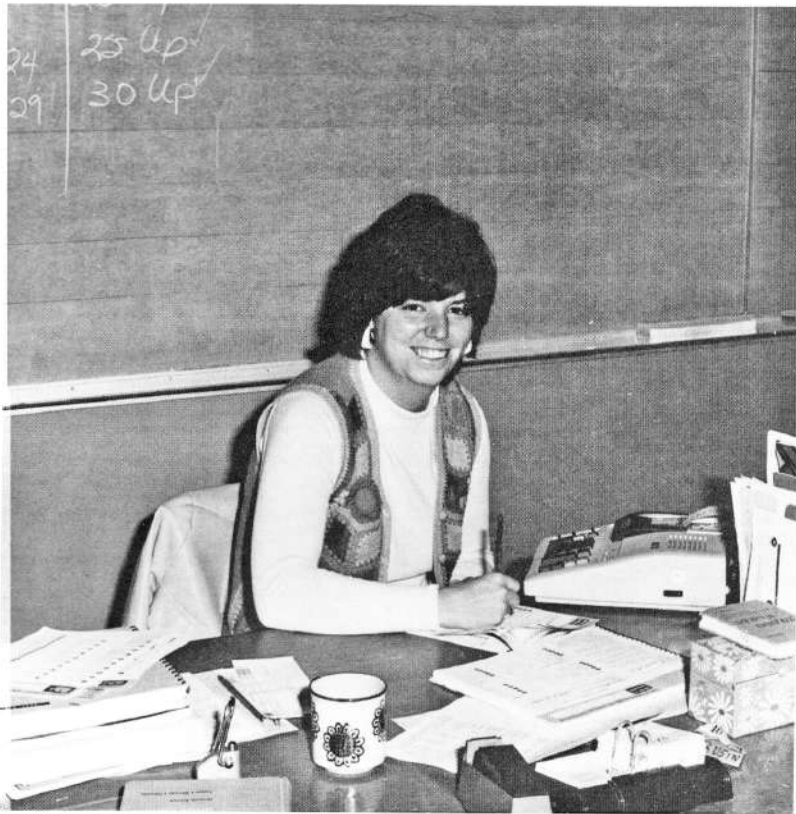

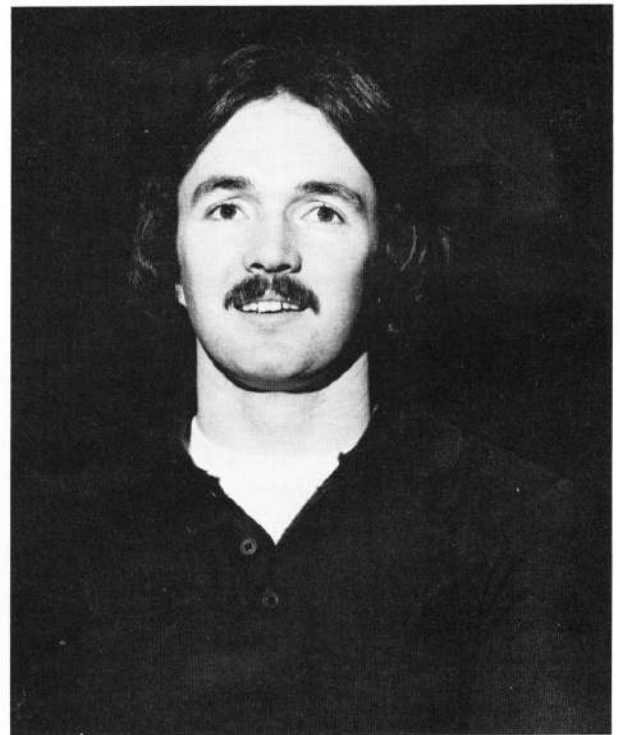
Richard Erdrich

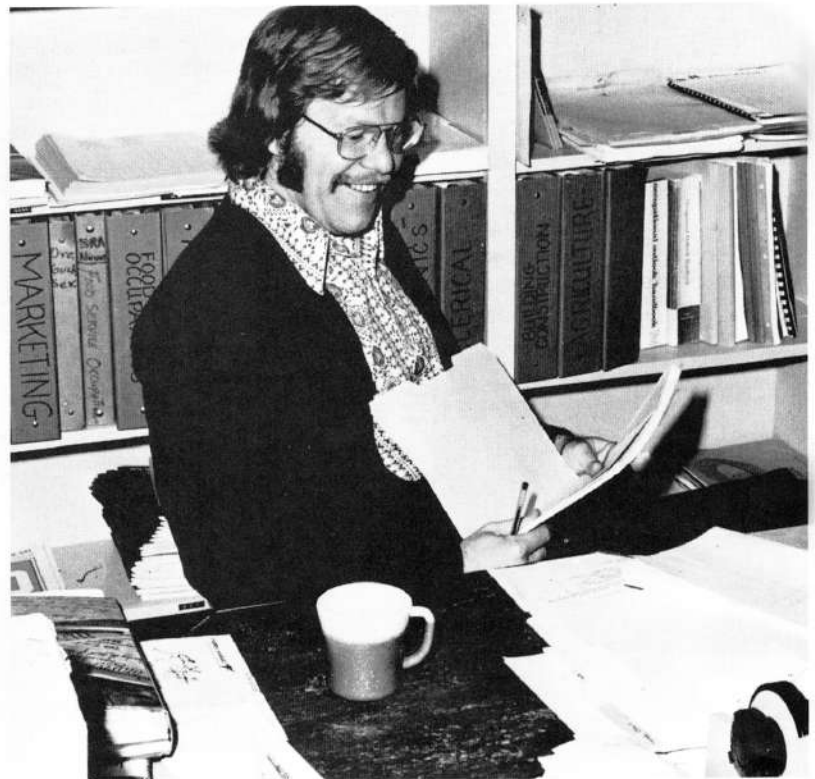

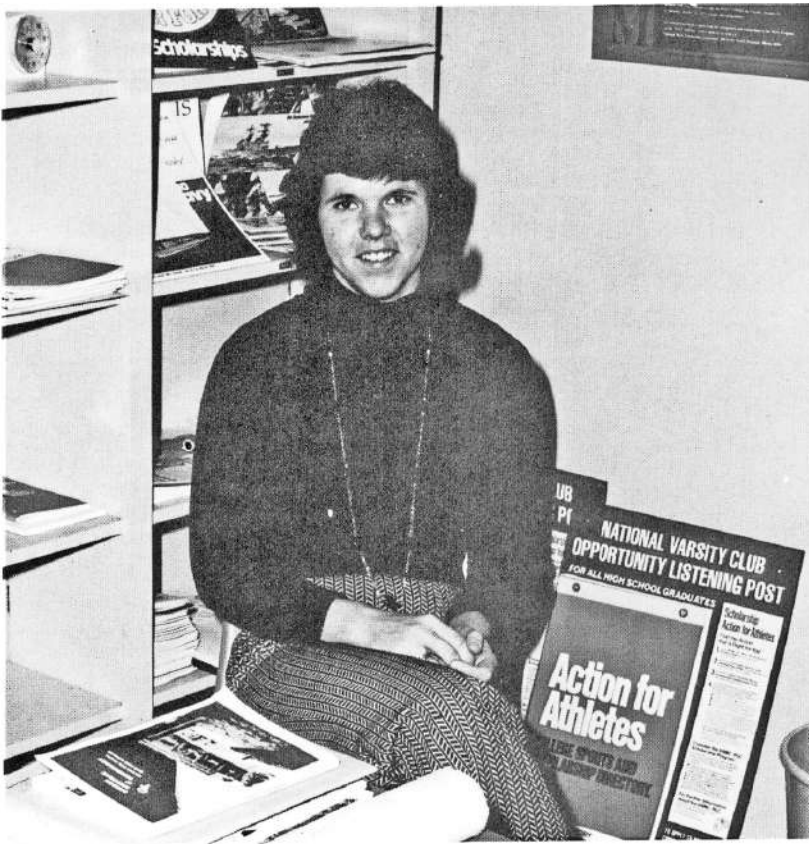

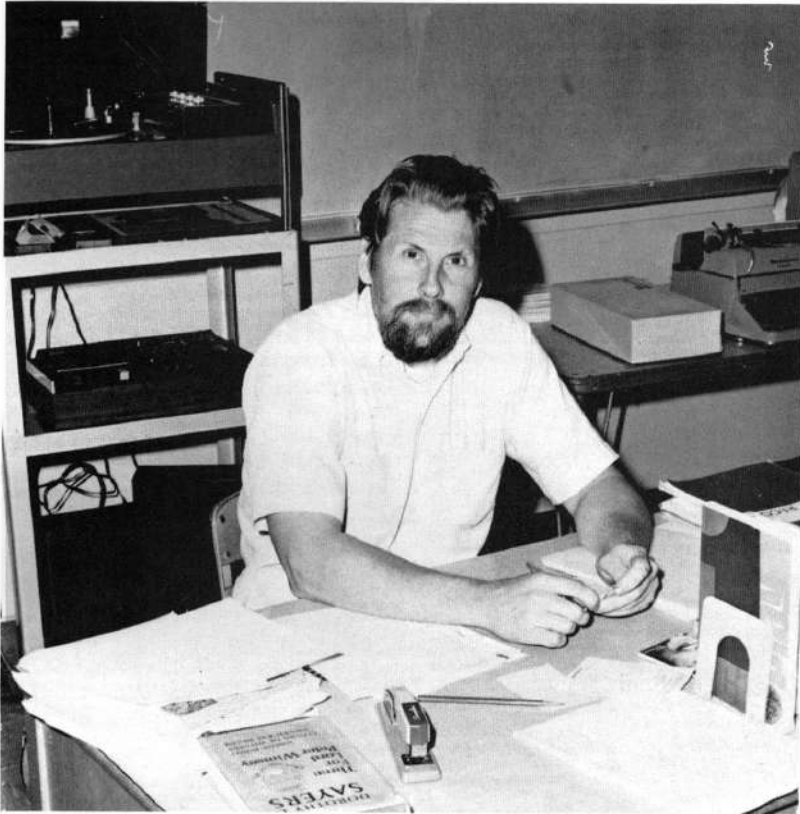
Sharon Wynn

William Beckman

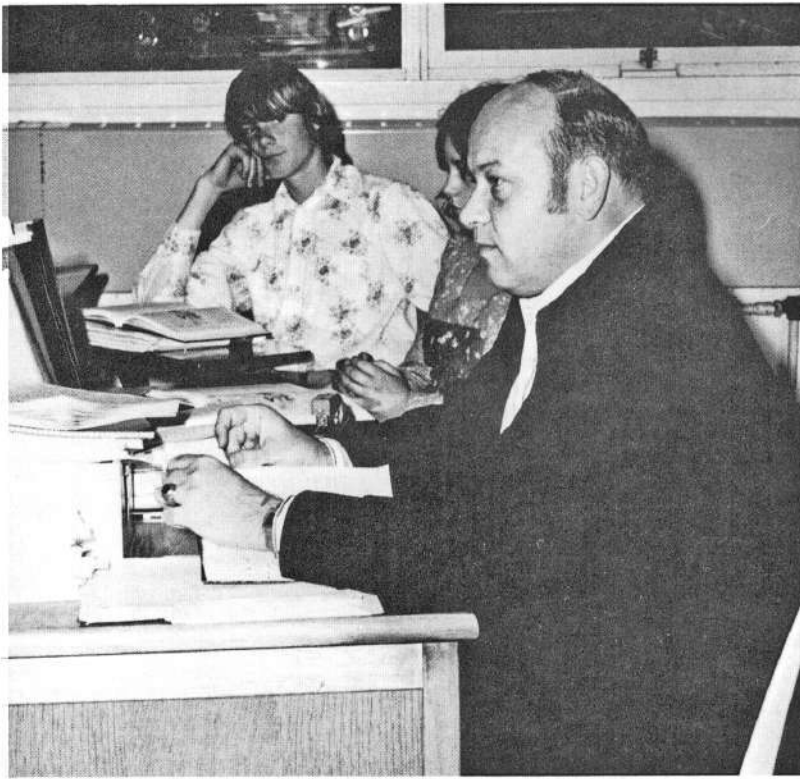

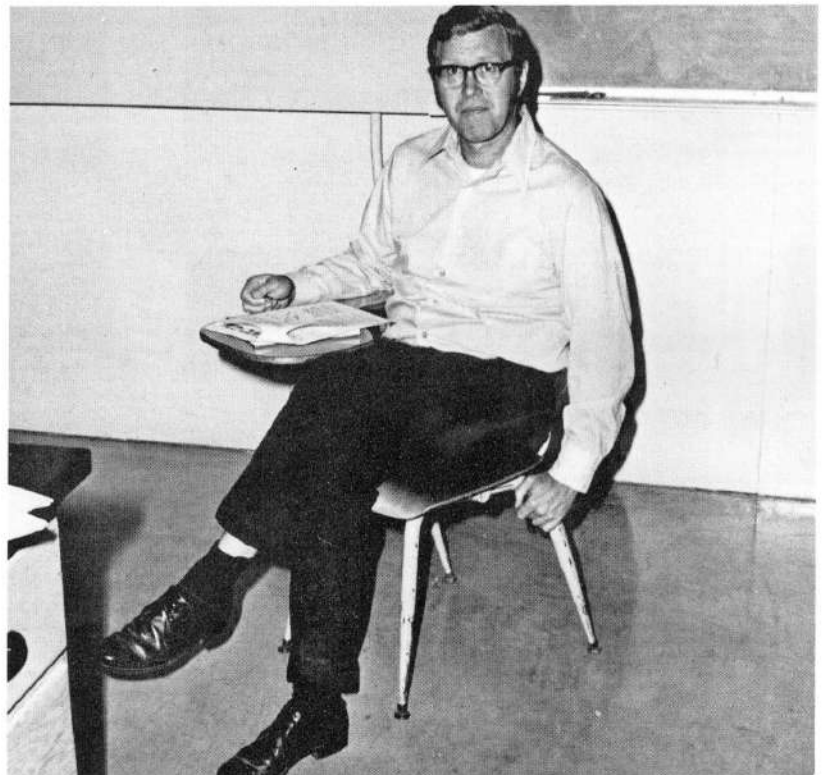
Marshall Dean Davis

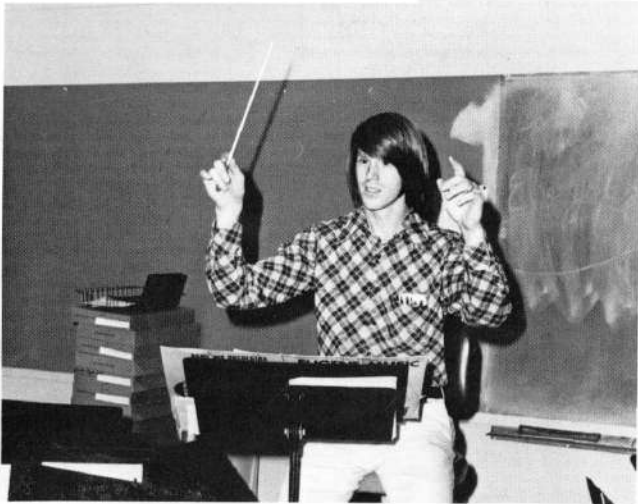
RETURN ANOTHER YEAR

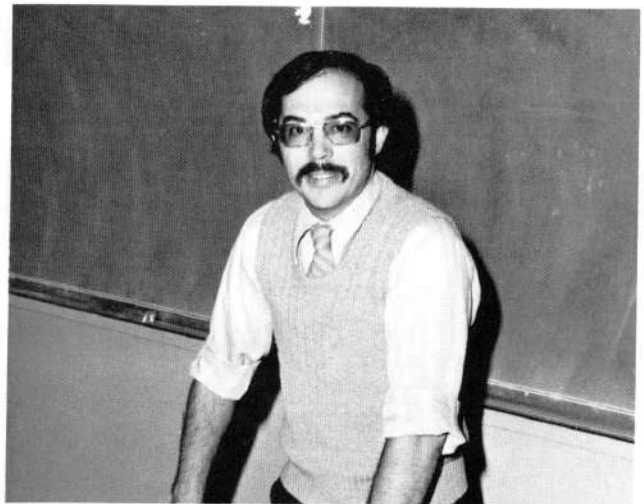

Thomas Radcliffe

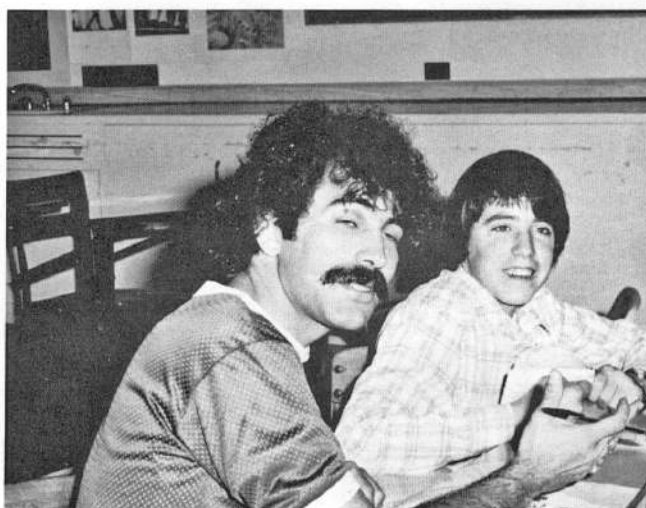

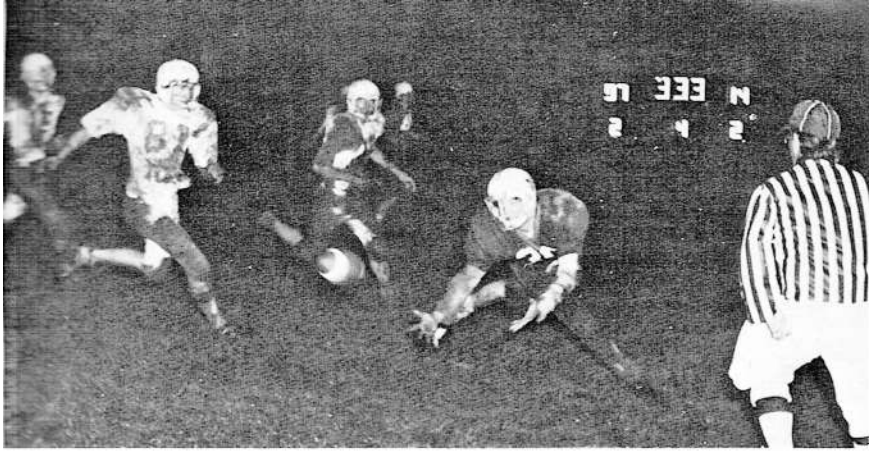

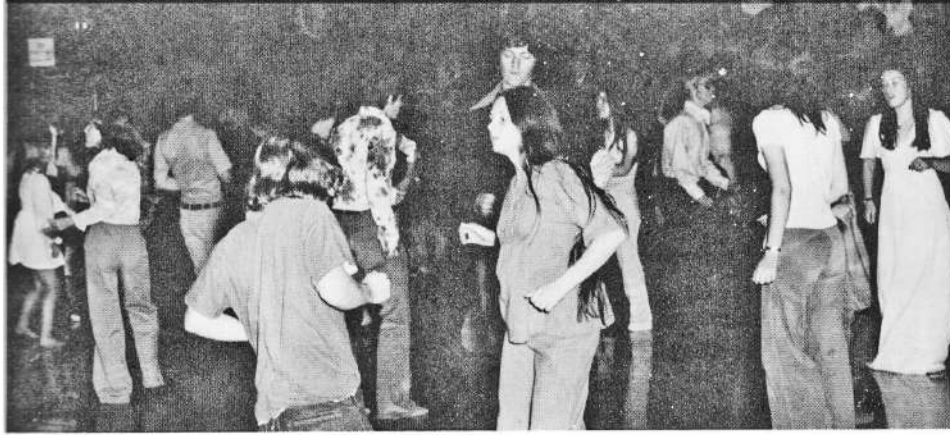

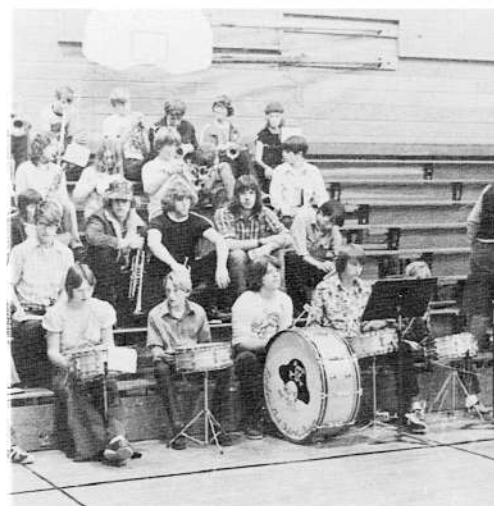

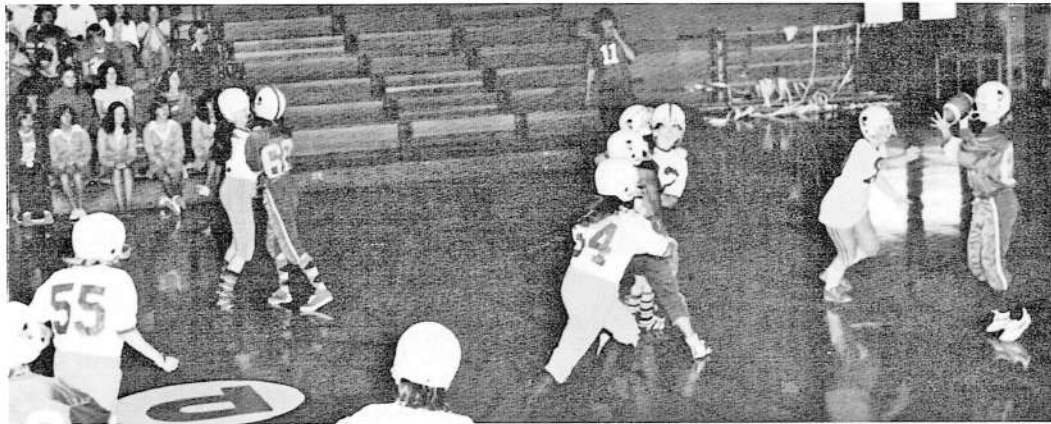

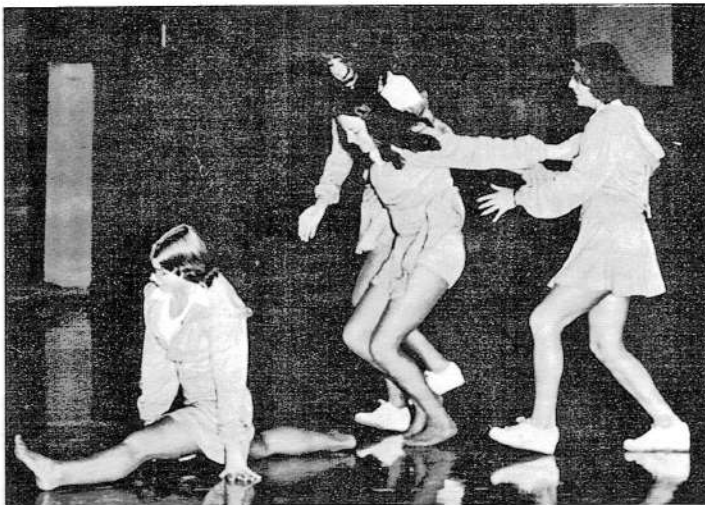

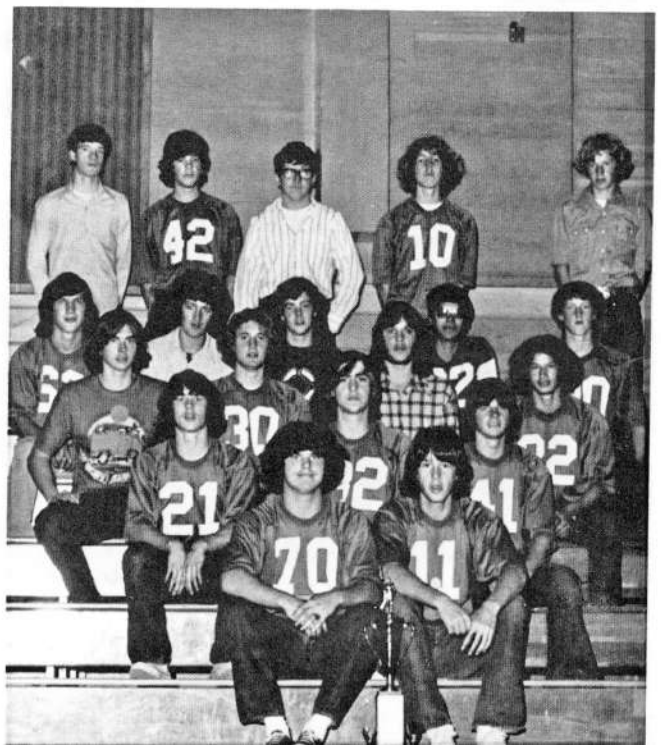
Membership in the Pacific Lettermen's Club consists of boys who have earned an athletic varsity letter in a sport either as a participant or as a manager.

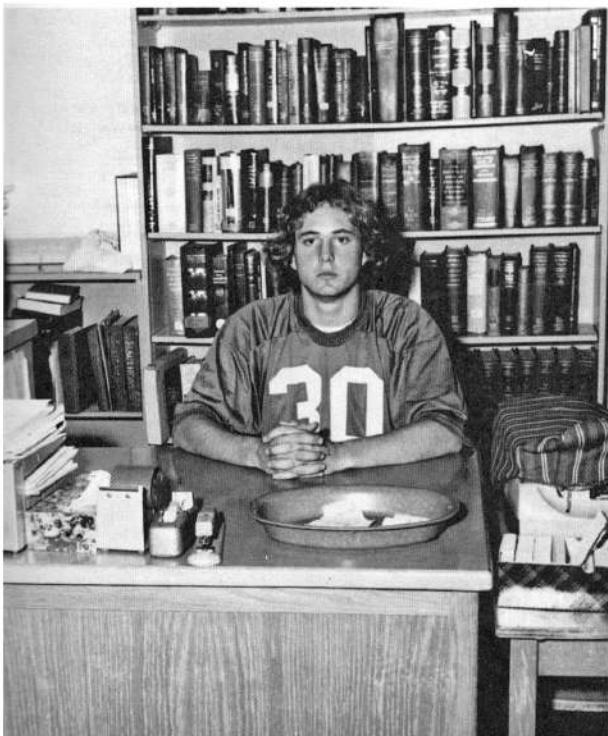

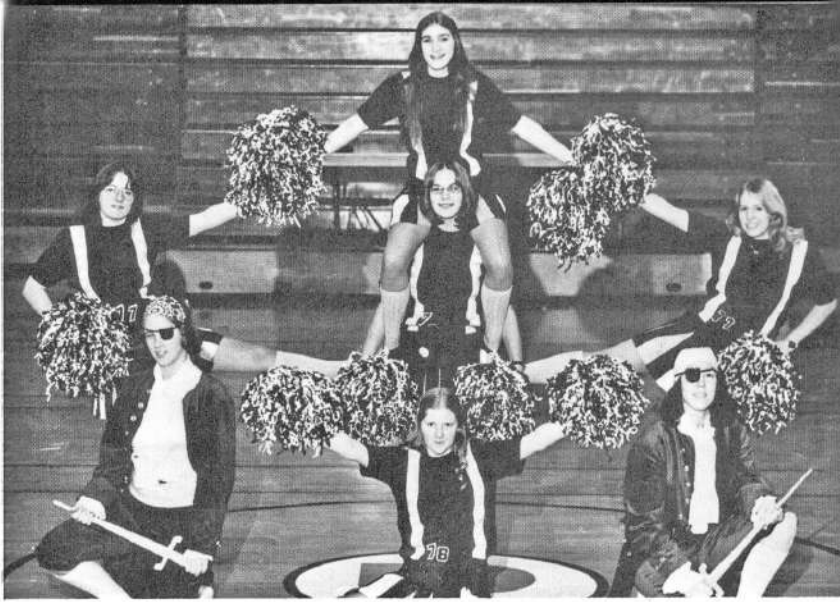

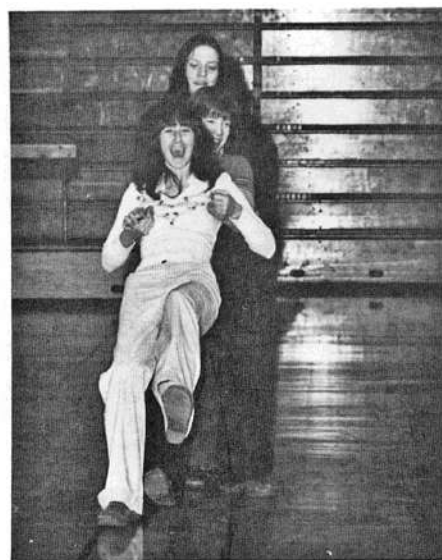

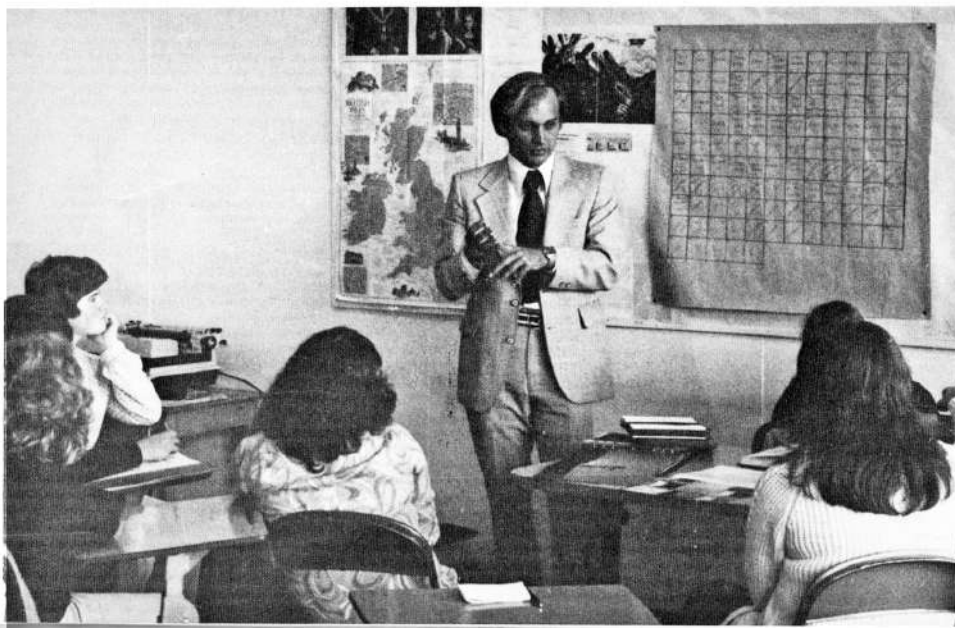

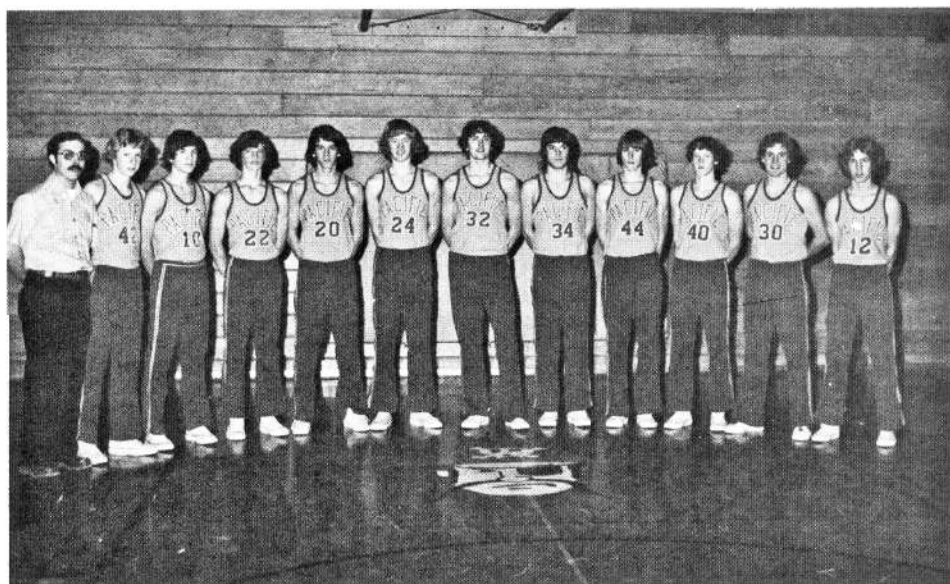

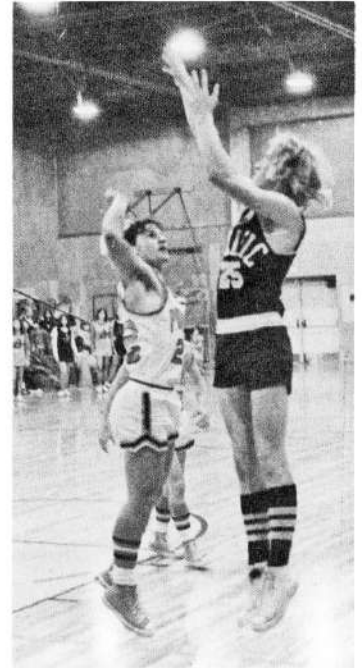

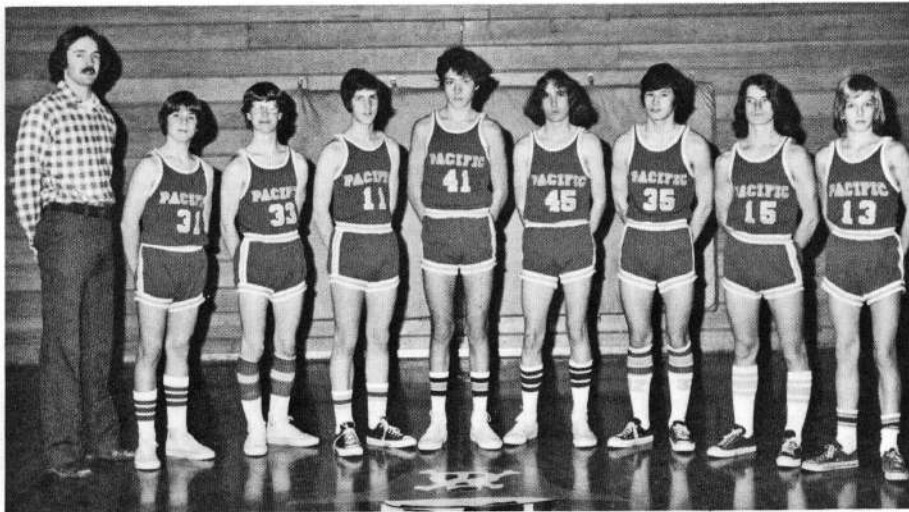

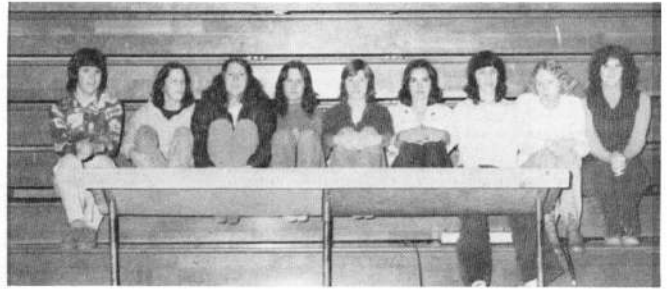
