"My Mother is picking me up in 20 minutes."

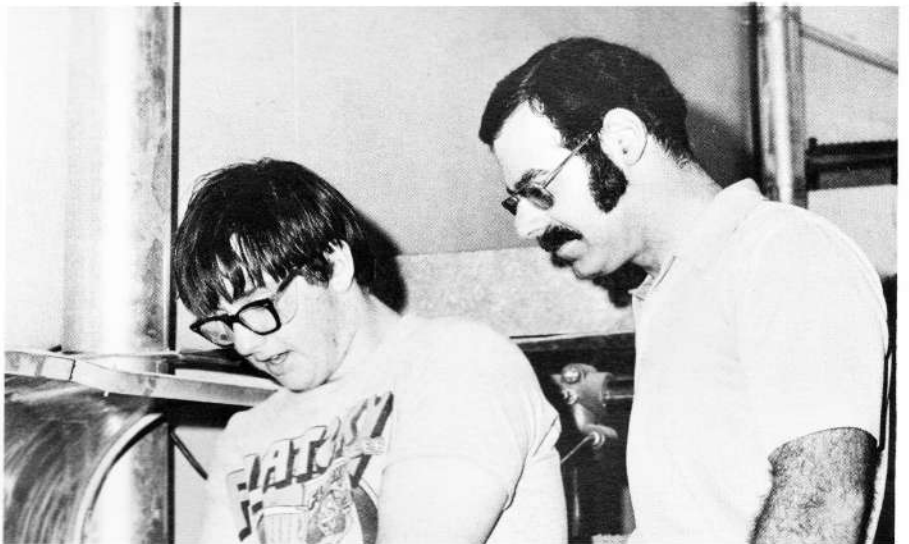
Up the down staircase? You bet it is, and most will be back next term. As the American poet Emily Dickinson said: "Much Madness Makes Divinest Sense."

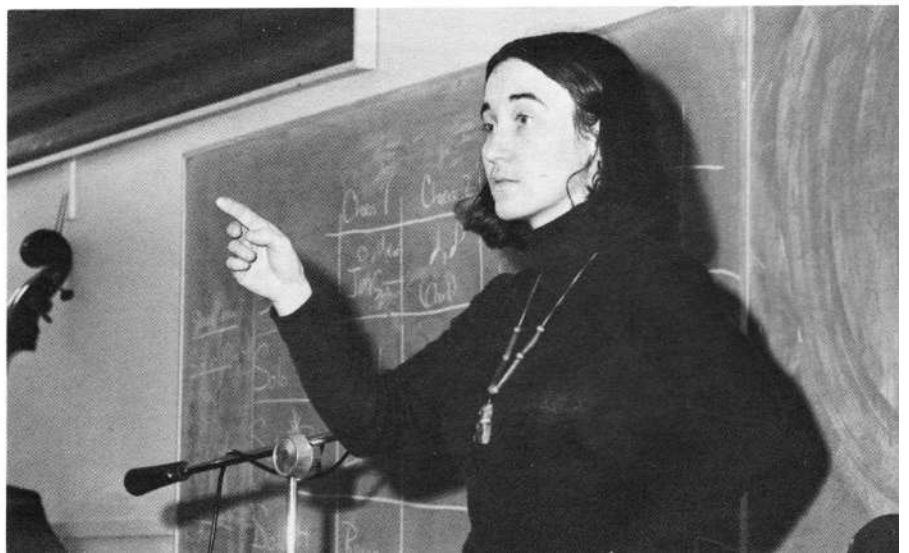

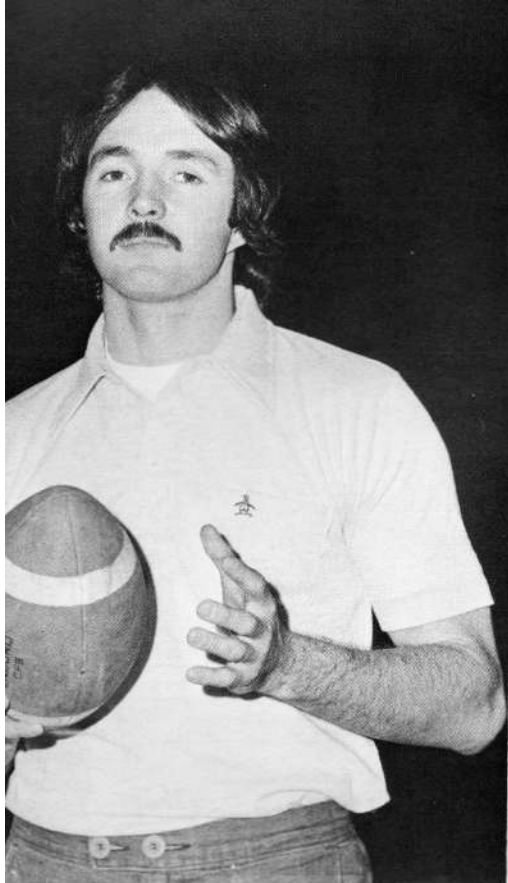
Ms. Van Valkenburg is our advisor of F.H.A. and the Senior Class advisor. Her hobbies are snow skiing, tennis, and swimming.

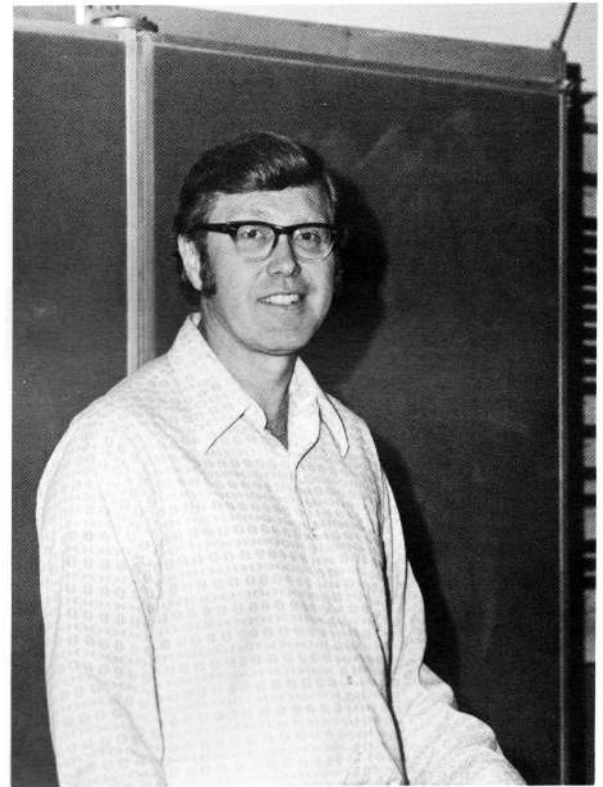
Mr. Radcliffe, B.S., M.S.

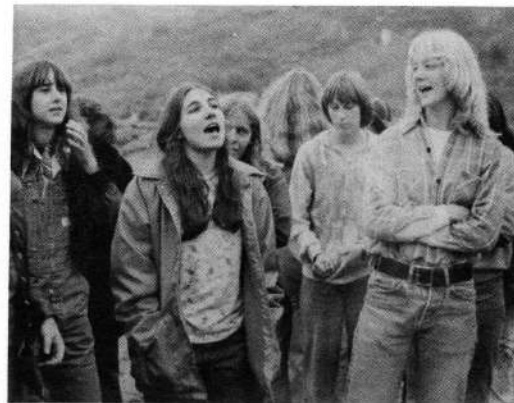


Parade Highlights Homecoming

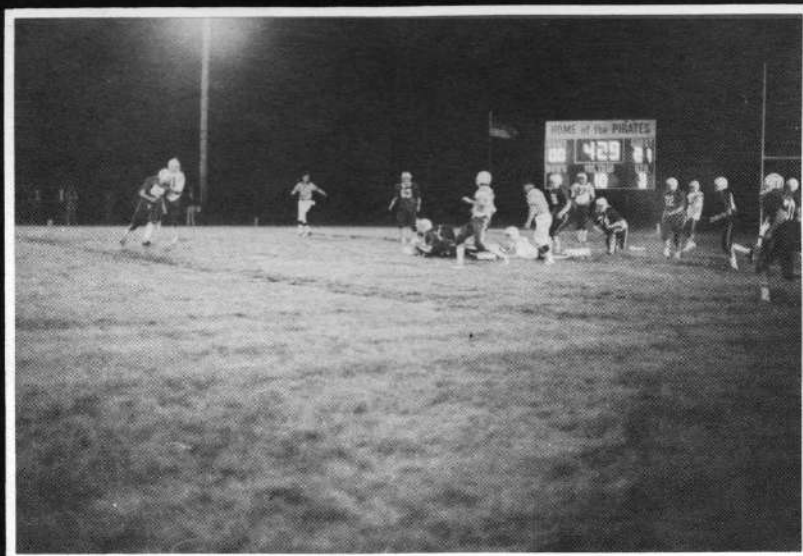
Varsity Football Sets

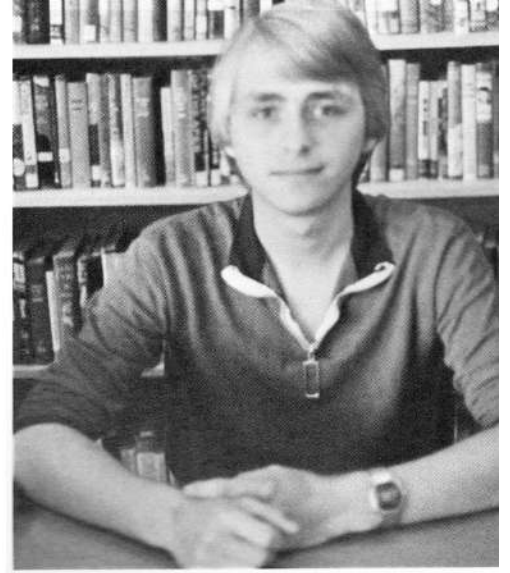
Students Participate in a Week of Governmental Activity in June at OCE and Willamette

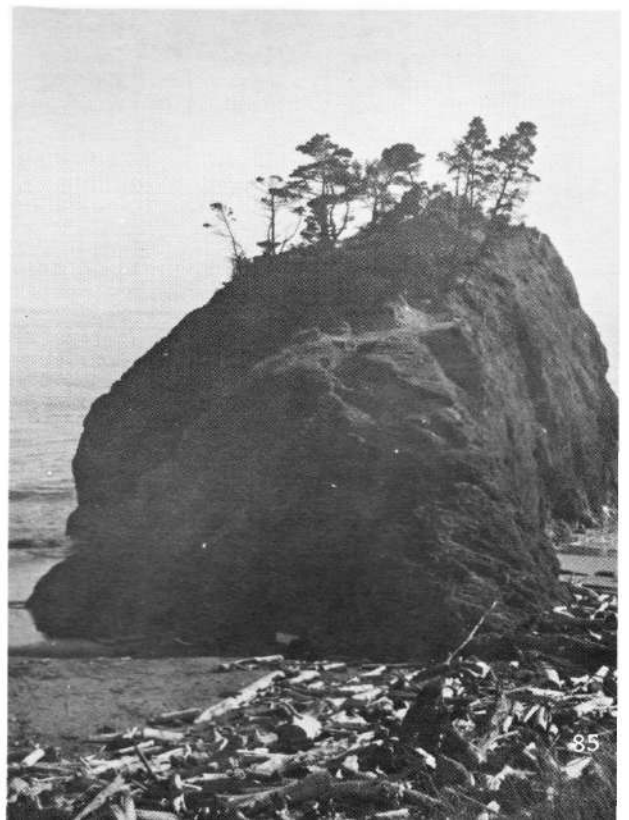
Every now and then the Annual Class likes to get out of the confines of a straight jacket and present some photographs that are not in a predetermined schedule. As is evident from a casual glance

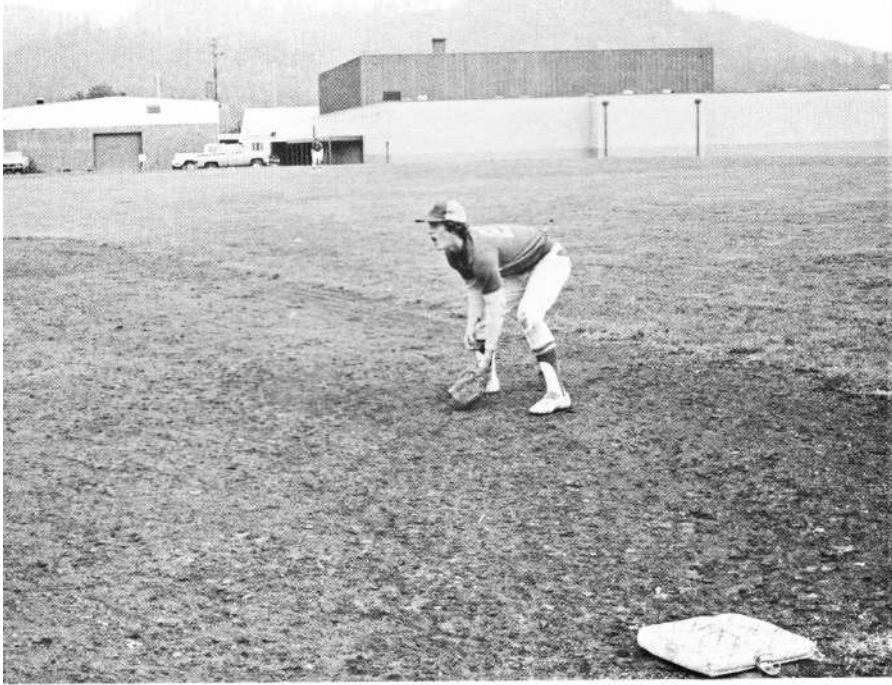


at this page and the preceding one, these groupings of photographs have absolutely nothing in common, and yet each one contains someone or something that touches our lives.

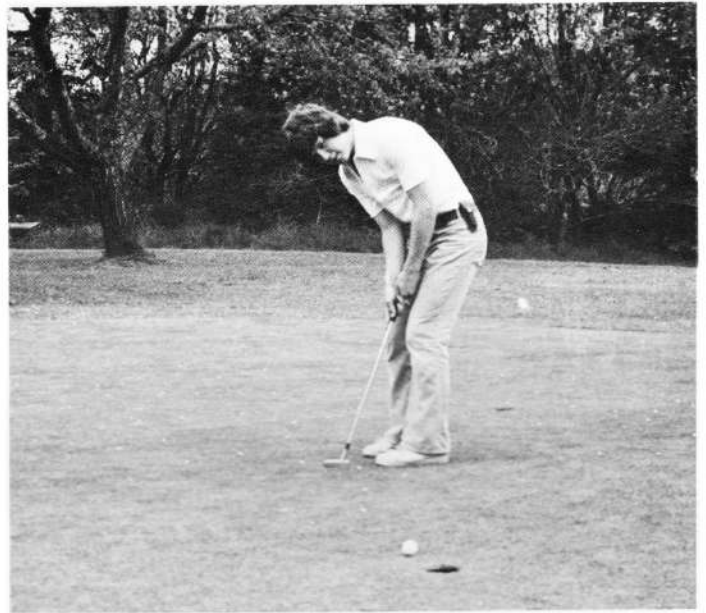

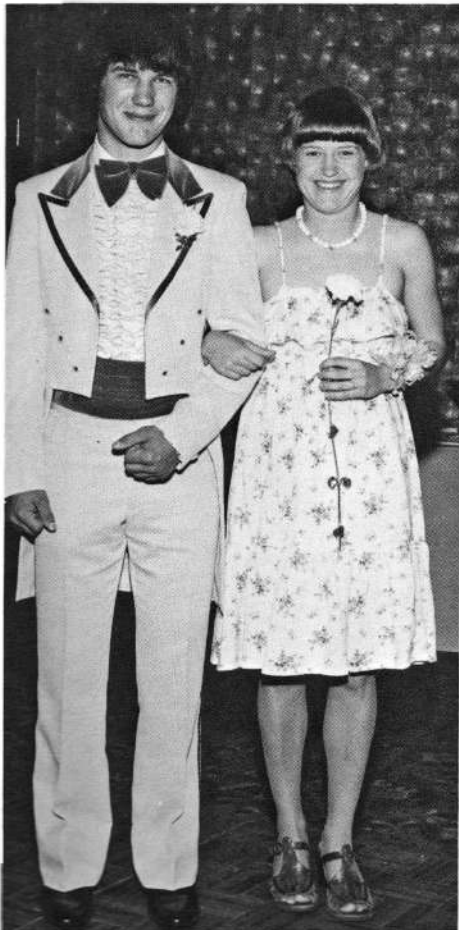

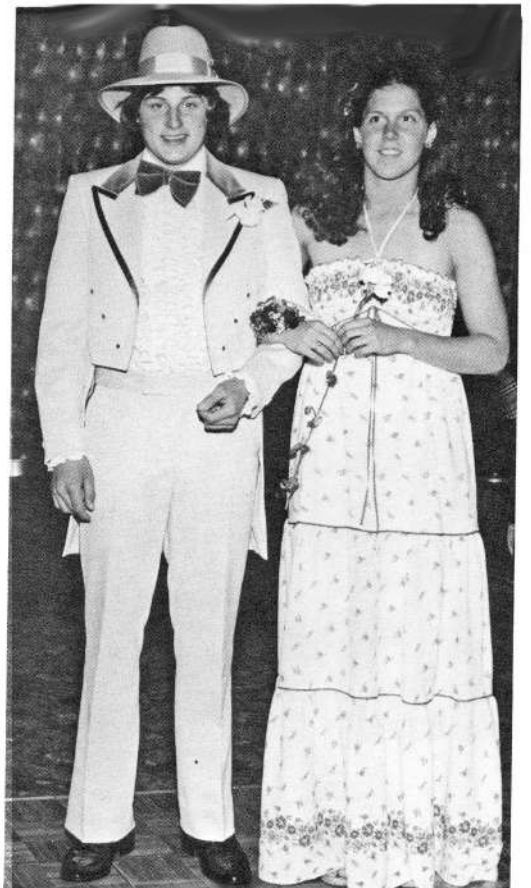
