A Big Success

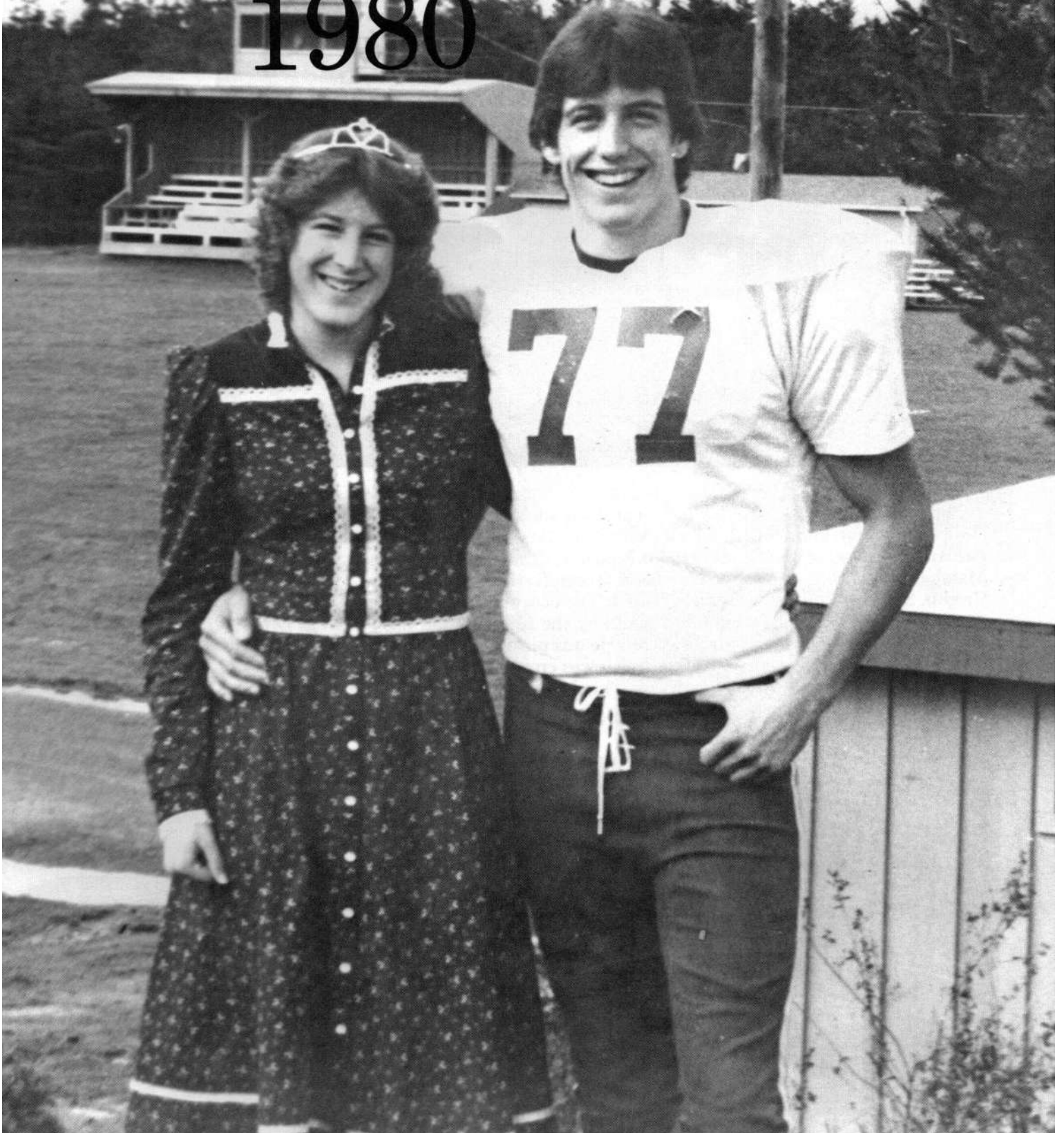

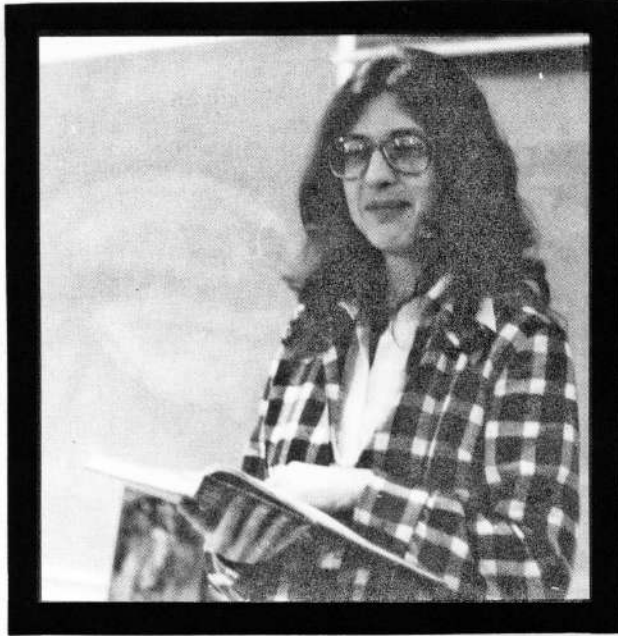
Business Are Explored

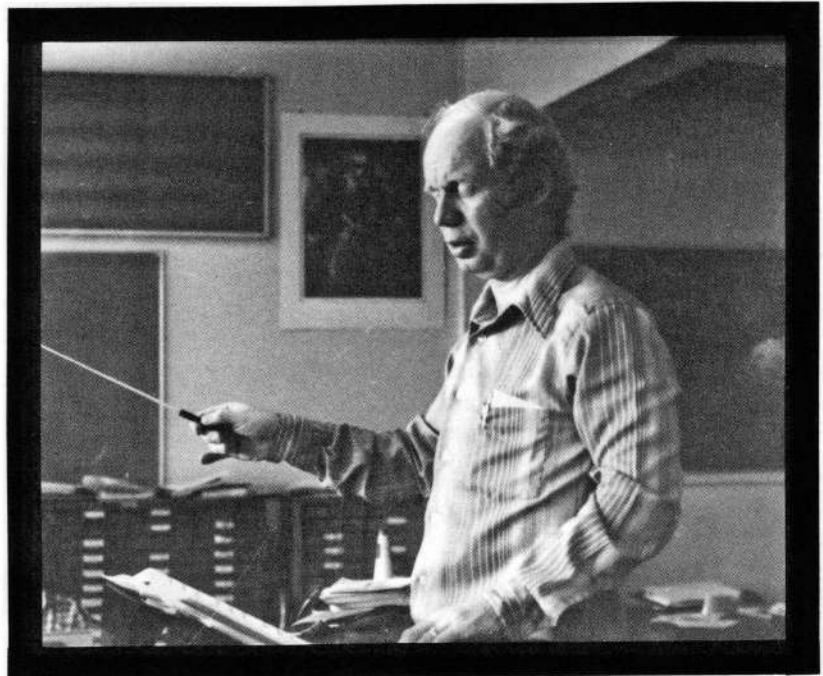


Music Harmonize

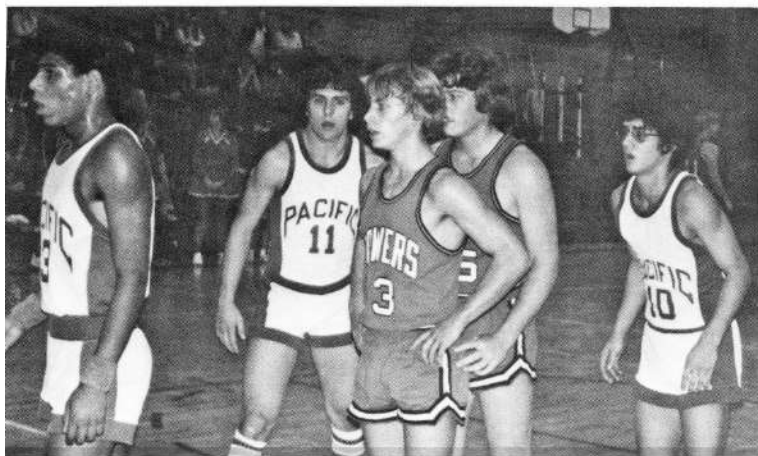
Pirates Participate

During this year's basketball season, the varsity basketball team won seven games out of the twenty games on the schedule.

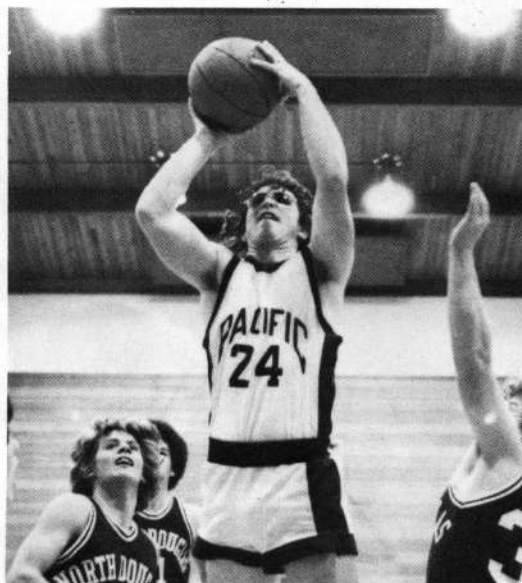
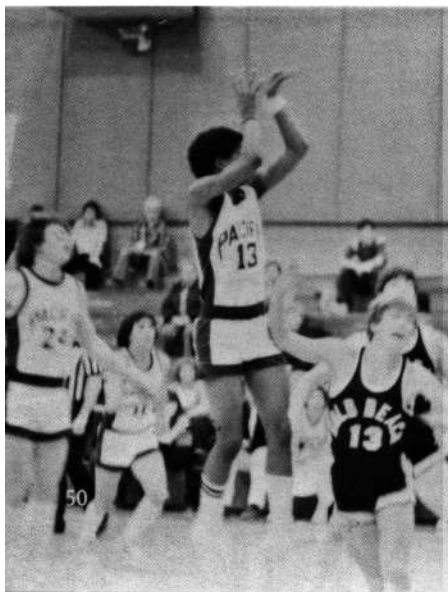
This year's leading scorer was Jeff Peabody who scored over 200 points.

The team defeated Powers early in the season, despite Powers going on to win the state "B" Championship.

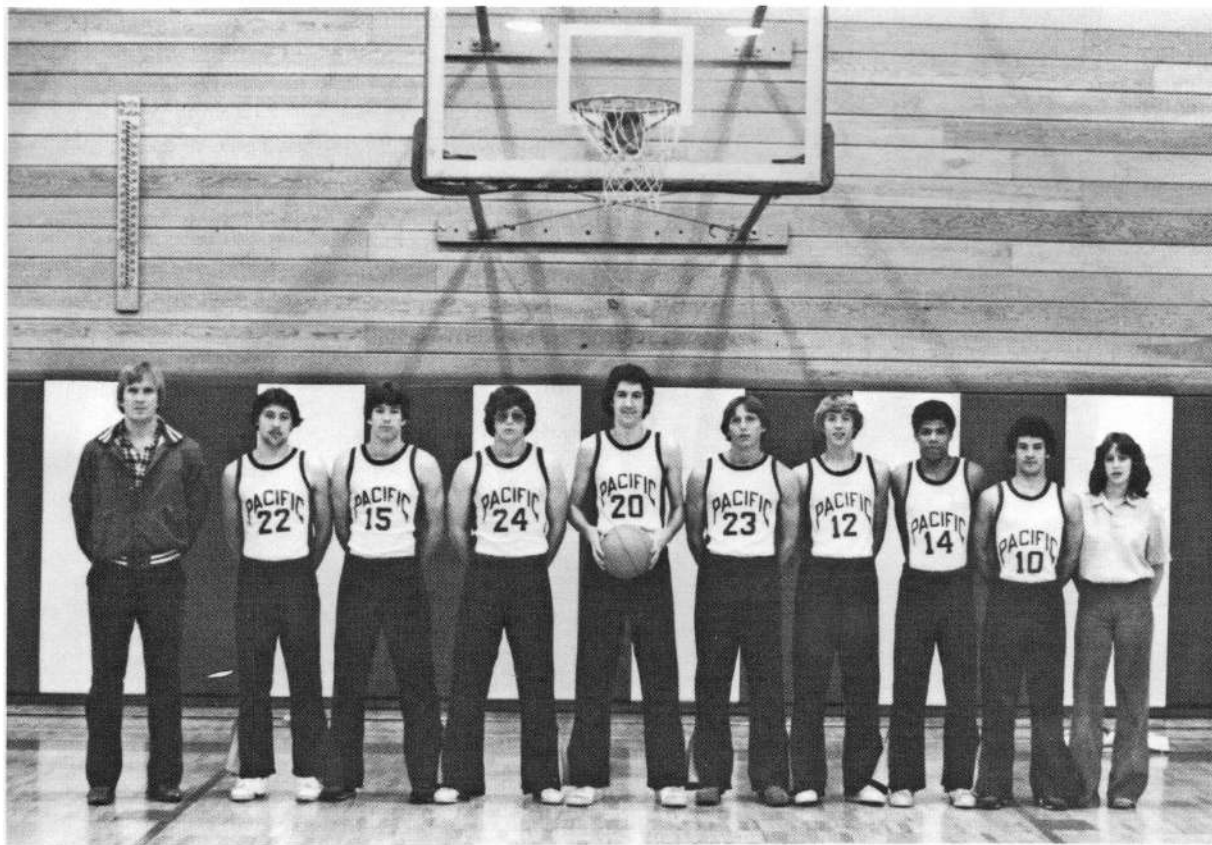

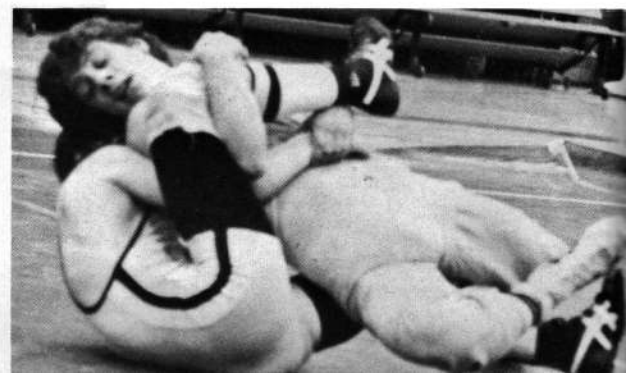
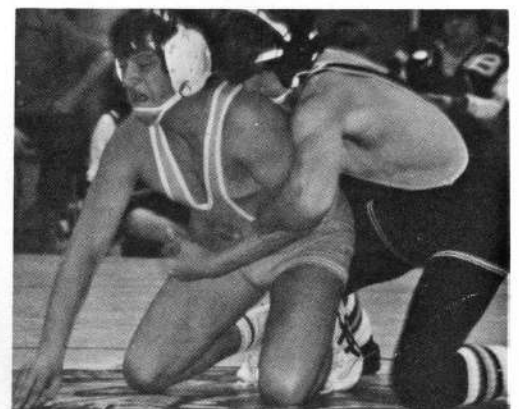
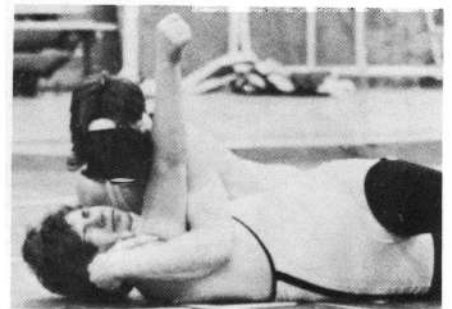


Wrestler Lent To State

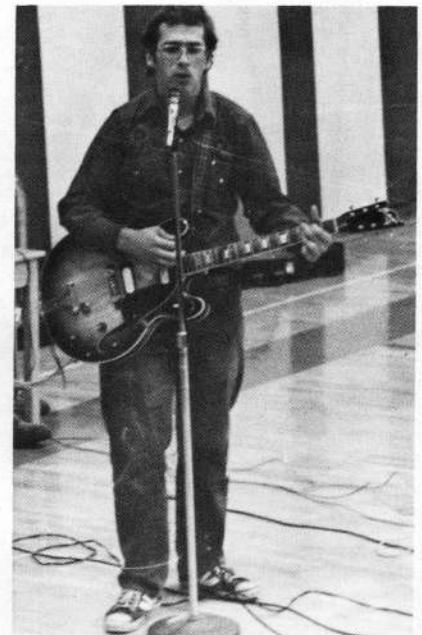

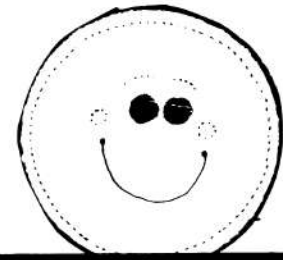
Pep band prepares for the big game!

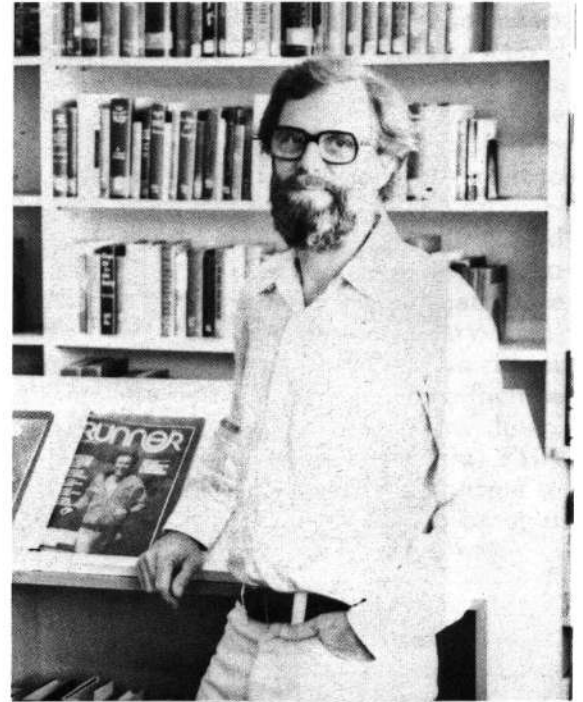

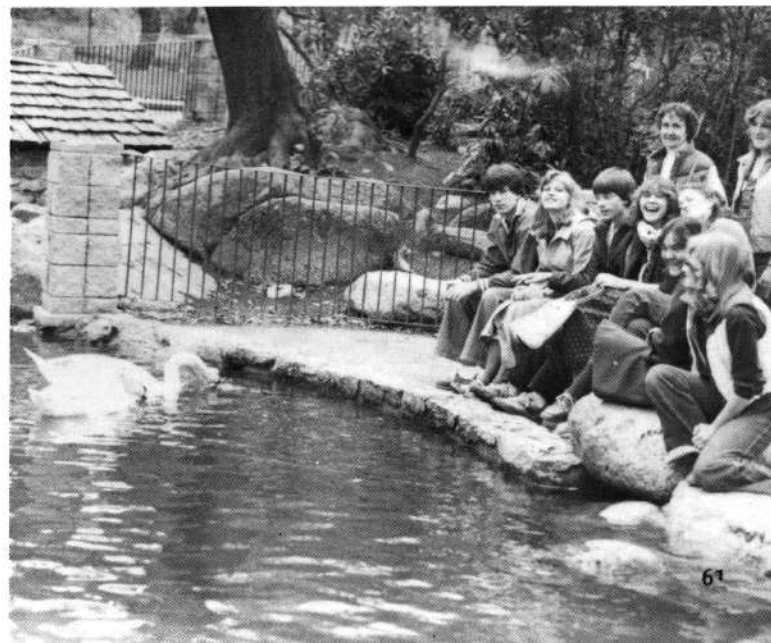

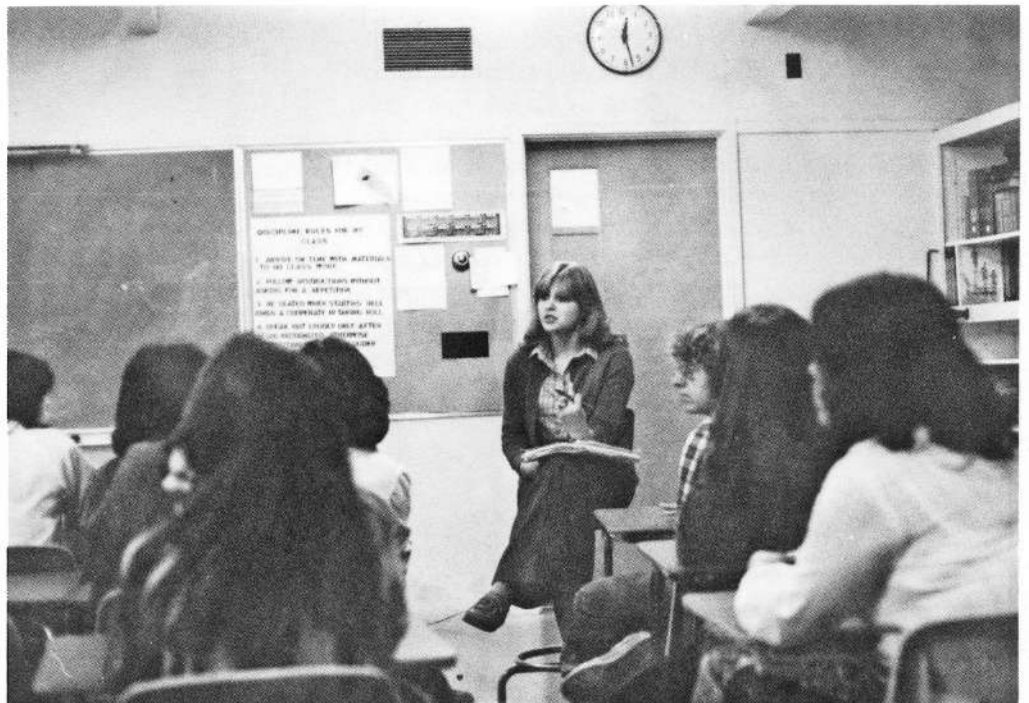

Student Council Achieves



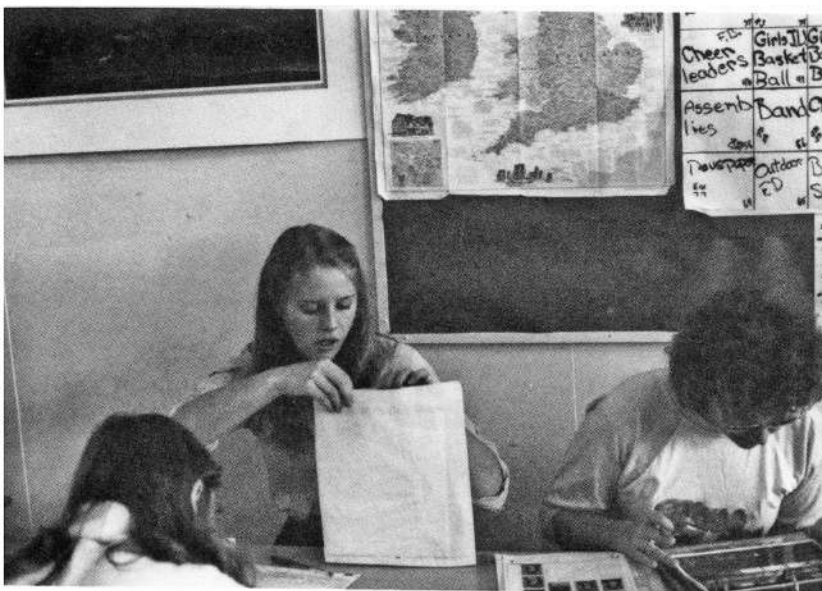

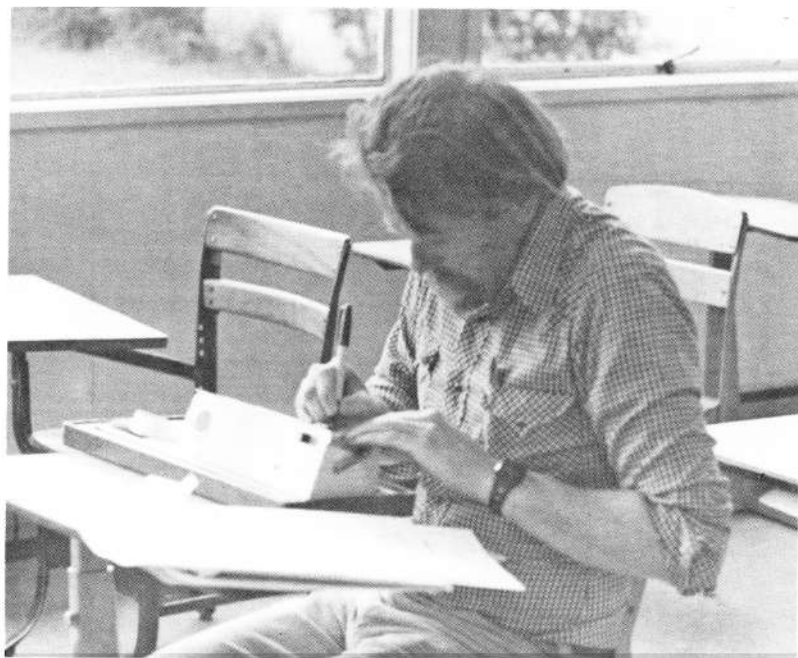


Putting together a year of your life in pictures and copy is a big job. It is a labor of love, but it is also a very special labor of memory.

The Outdoor Education Program was very exciting this year. Each and every counselor had very individual tasks to perform. They had to teach a craft and participate in every class.

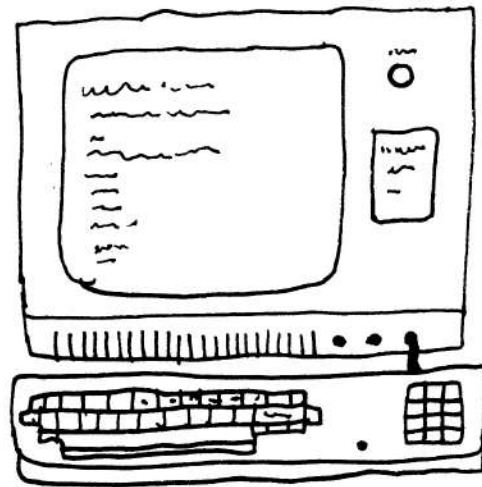


This And That

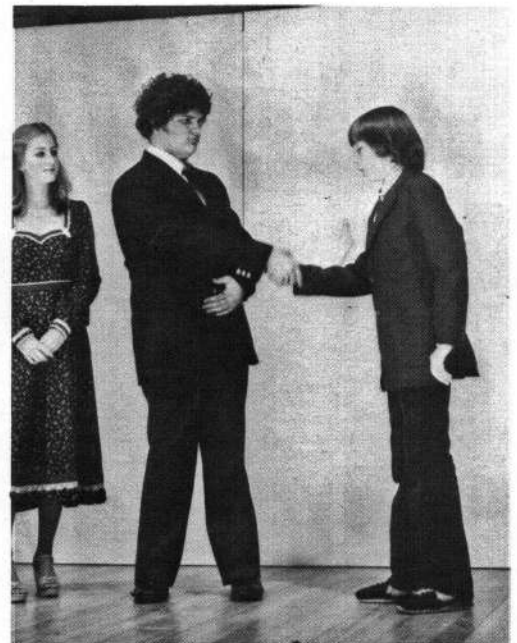

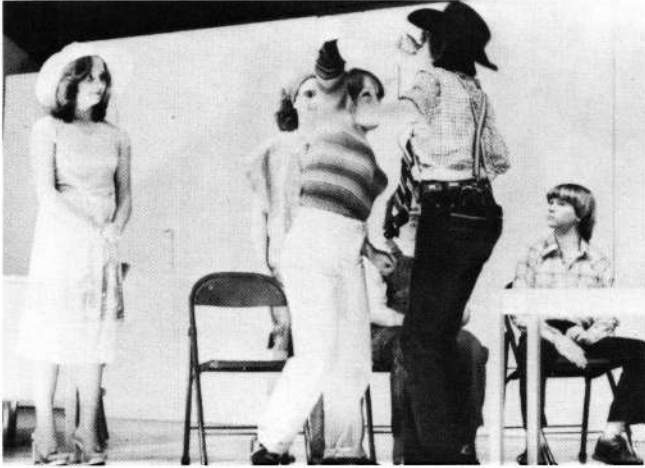

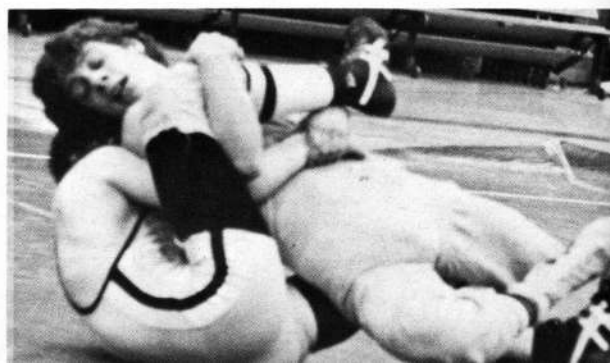
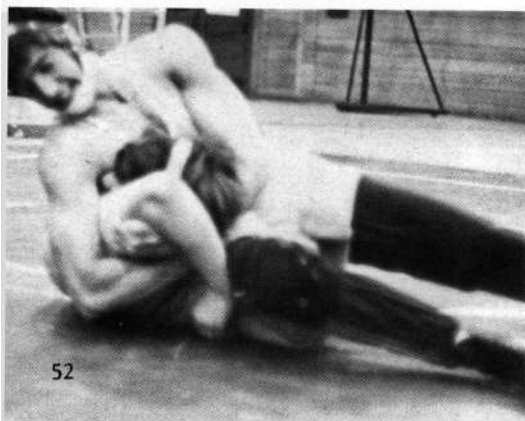
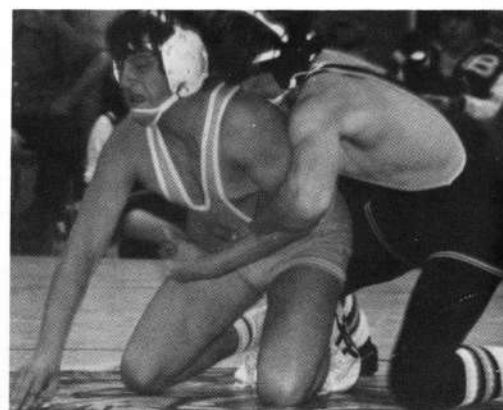
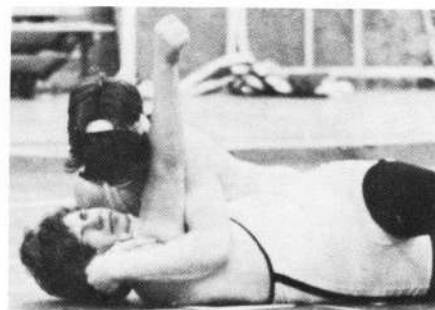


Wrestler Lent To State

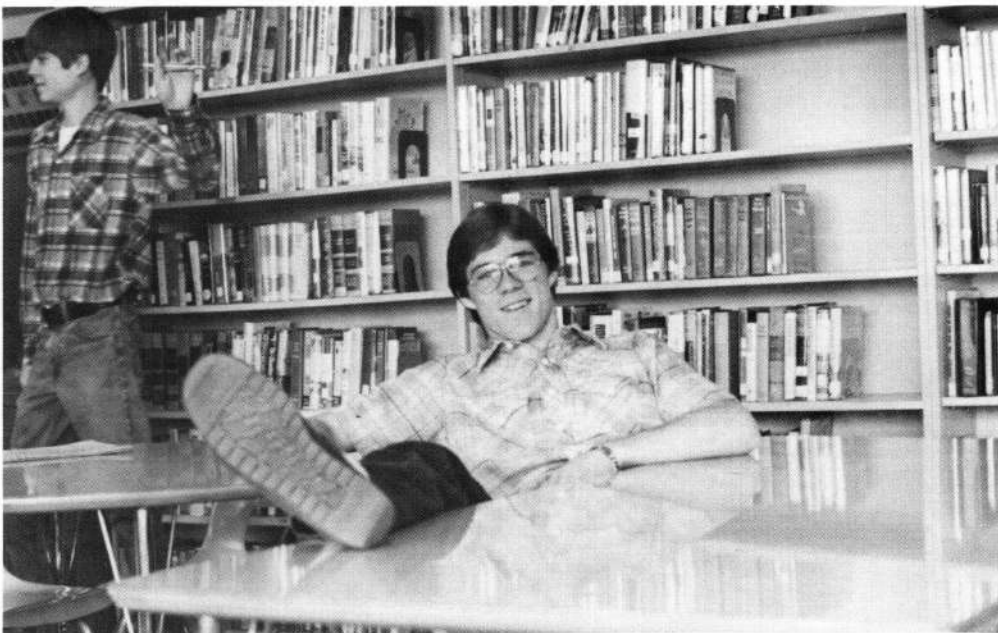
This year's valedictorian is Elizabeth Radcliffe. She has been especially interested in poetry and in running for the Cross Country and track teams.

Only time can tell.

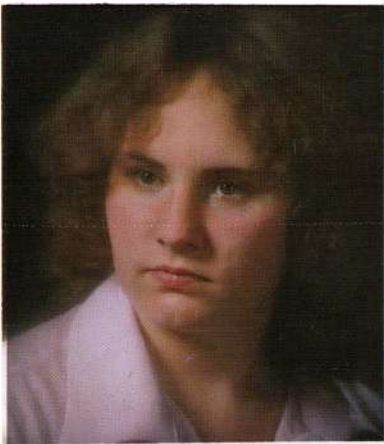

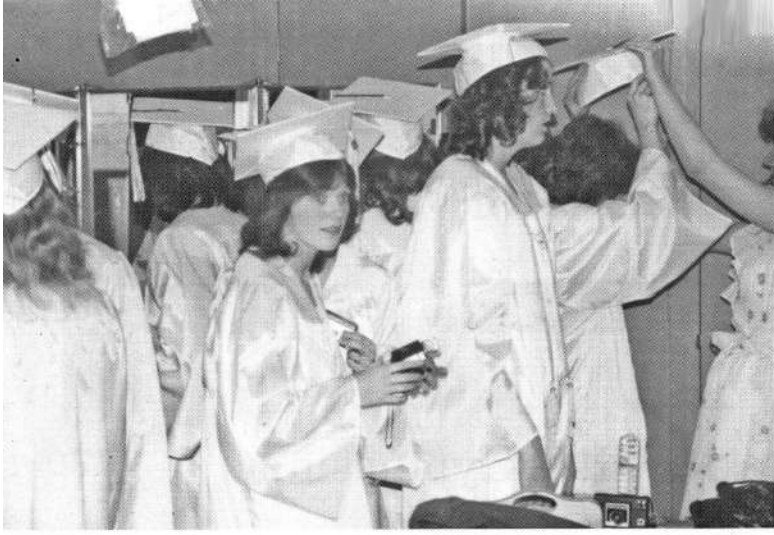
This year's graduating class held one of the shortest programs on record on May 29 in the high school gym.

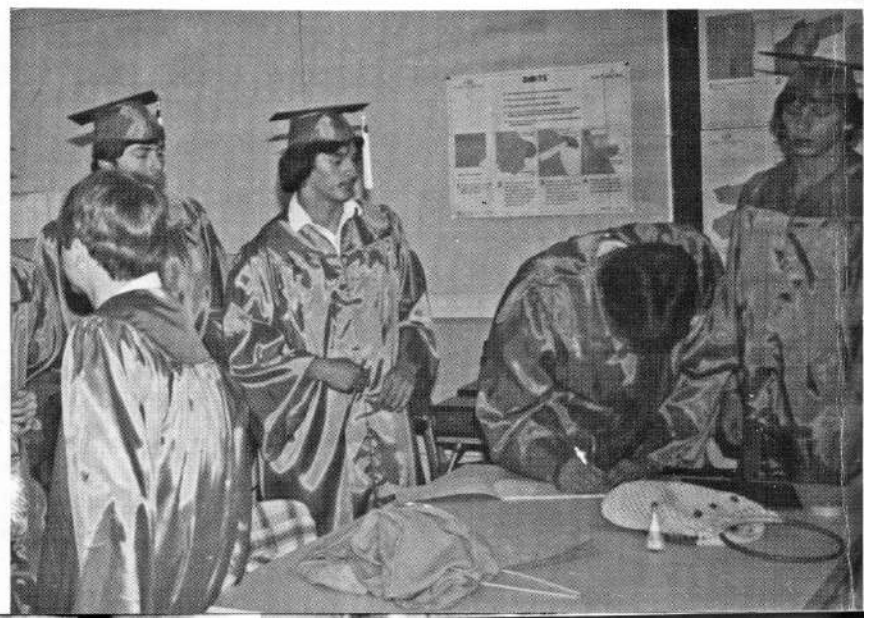
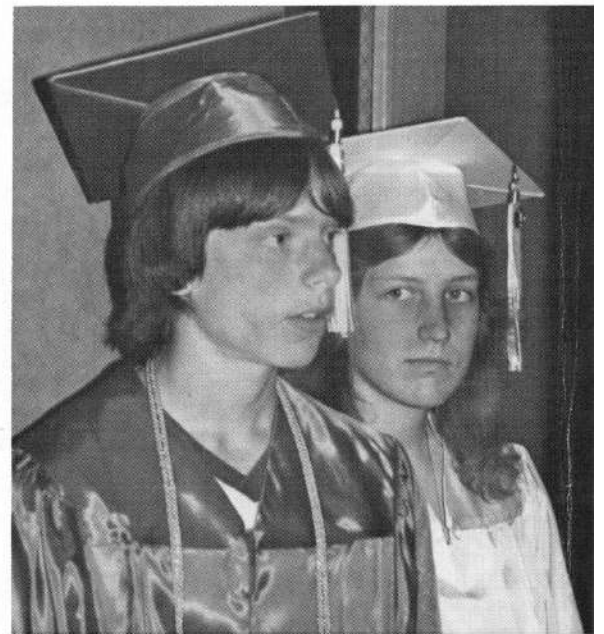
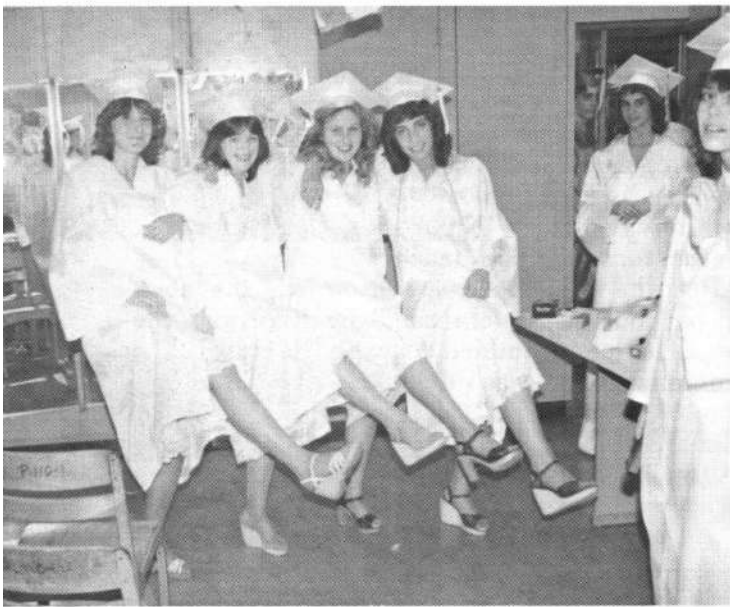

Left, Elizabeth and Ron, who graduated one and two in grade point average, enter the gym.

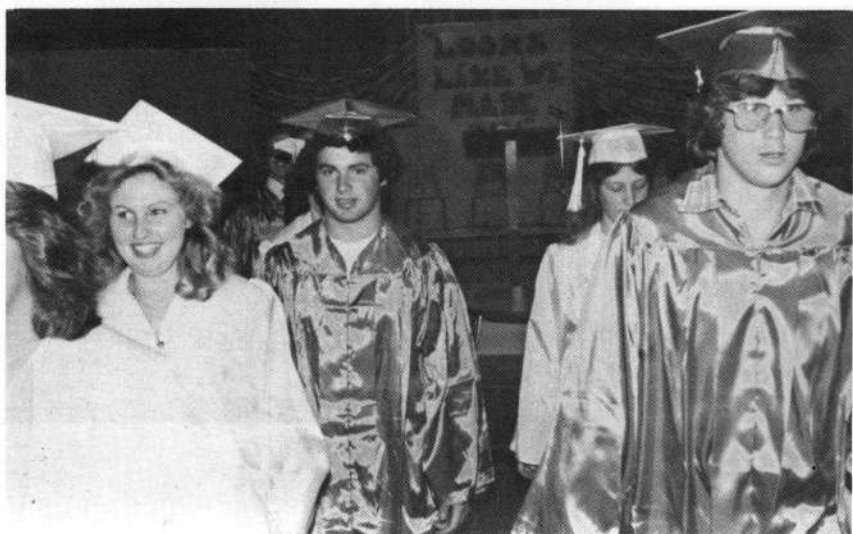
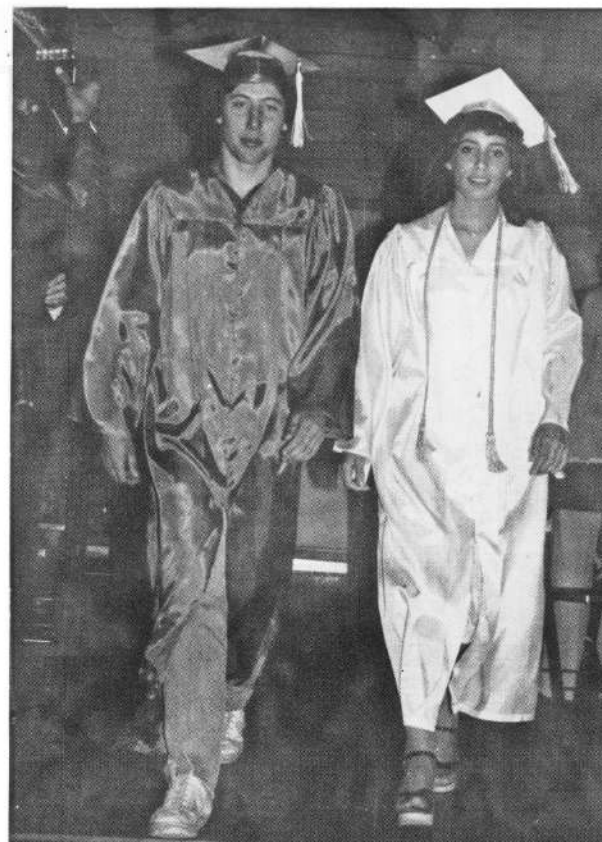
