





of heart aches. They were put in solidarity.





Davis & Beckman Teach English




Mr. Dean Davis teaches upper division English, speech, and creative writing. He advises the Jr. class, and the Annual Staff and works with the Talented and Gifted students.



Elective In Spanish, Art




Previously, Mr. Bold has taught at Linn-Benton Community College, and worked on many industrial projects.

Business, Home Ec.,



Mr. Wahl Serves Twenty Years.



Mrs. Bette Adams is bookkeeper for the school district. She works in the district office, operates the computer, and pays the bills.




Mrs. Gurlah Marsh is assistant bookkeeper for the school district. She works at the district office with Mrs. Adams.

Mrs. Samudio is always around to lend a helping hand in finding information in the library.






















Deb Rooks Is ASB President






Tessa, Shawn Chosen For Girls', Boys' State
