


















This year's annual staff was made up of four Seniors, three Juniors and one Freshman. Throughout the year, staff members came and went. These few finished up the year and kept busy every day.







Then comes the hours of interviewing people, creating new style for the article and research.


After all this, everyone fights for the computers to get their articles in on time.

at state in Pendleton, OR.



Riddle Irish. The score was Pirates-31, Irish-30.


The team was young and virtually inexperienced, consisting of two freshmen, (who also played J.V.), four sophomores, two juniors, and three seniors.

At State Perry Pendergrass started out wrestling the person that later won state. In his second match he was injured, and thus ruined his chance to go further in the competition.





1984 Homecoming Week





For the first year since 1978, golf has been renewed at Pacific High, thanks to a couple of determined golfers, a generous citizen of the community, and a supportive school board.


Mr. Don Merrick of Port Orford donated his time and effort to be a coach of the prospective golf team.

The 1984 baseball season started out with a lot of members and much excitement. As the season progressed, the number went down but the spirit remained high and proud.


