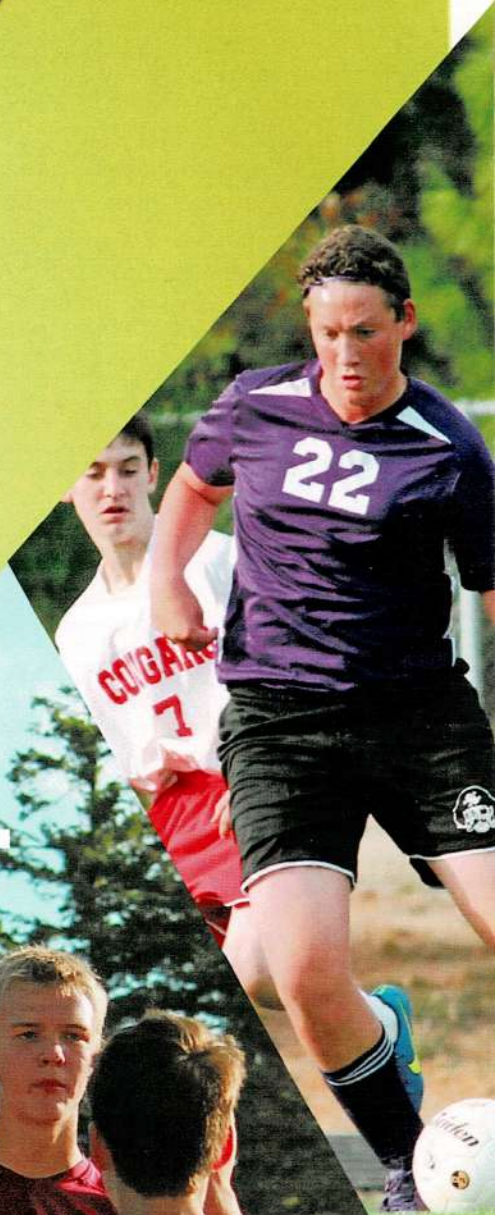




# WORK HARD, PLAY HARD

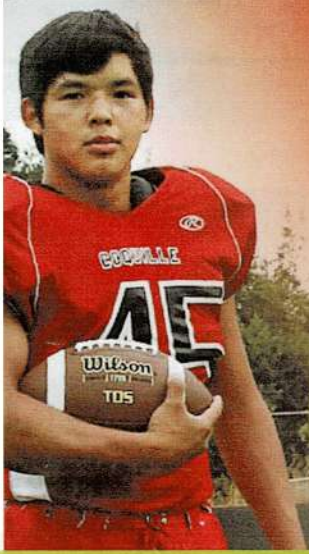
