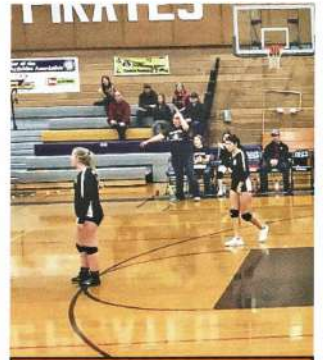
Senior Night

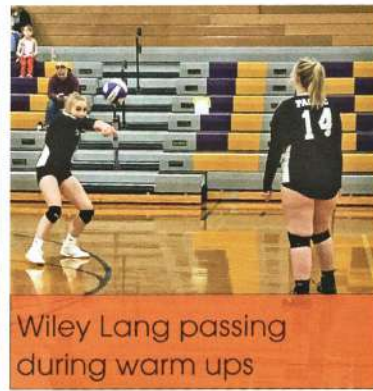

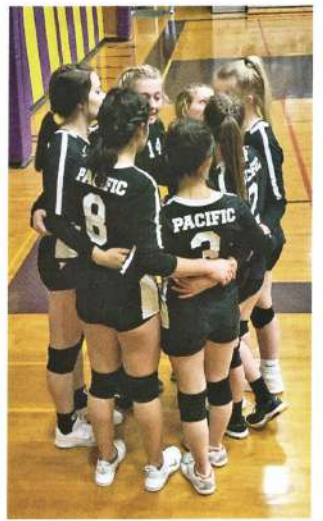

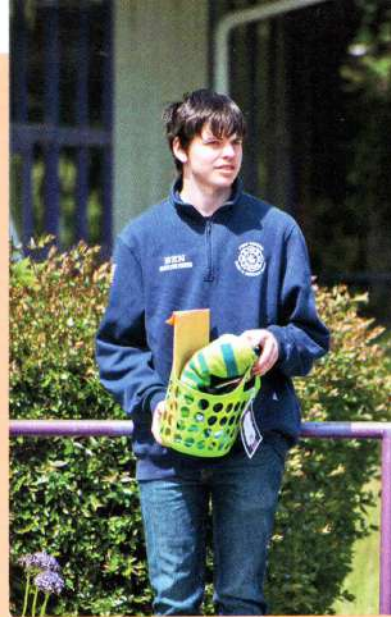


Atticus will be attending University of Oregon next fall.

Ben will be attending South Western Oregon Community College in the fall and majoring in electrical engineering.

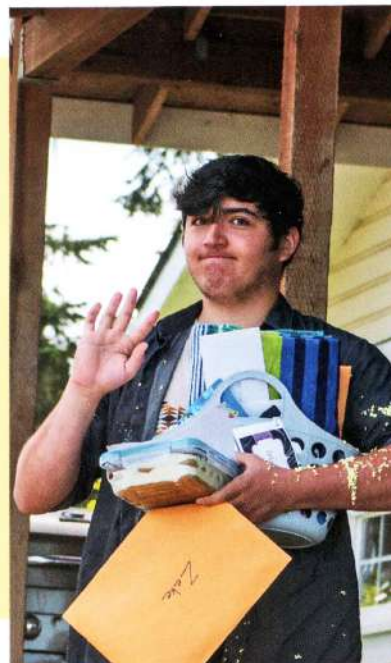
